PUBLIC HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE

Minutes of previous meetings. (11/18/19)

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the minutes of the previous meeting on 11/18/19. Motion carried 4-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications

Rasmussen stated there is one denial recommendation of an Operator's License for Peyton Stefan, who has the right to address the committee.

Peyton Stefan appealed to the committee stating she submitted rehabilitation documents last week for the Police Chief to review, which included: a personal letter, proof of her OWI assessment & rehabilitation she attended- a driver's safety class at NTC, proof of payment of the first OWI, and a payment plan for the second one. She indicated she also submitted her school transcripts showing she is enrolled in the Dental Hygiene Program at NTC, to show she has placed her time elsewhere and doing constructive things with her life. She commented since she stopped drinking she joined a gym and does personal training to occupy her time. She asked for forgiveness for the decisions she made in 2017 and that she has done a lot of growing up since then. She pointed she has not ever had any other alcohol related offense. She stated a license would allow her to take on more managerial positions in the establishments where she works.

Chief Bliven stated he reviewed all the evidence of rehabilitation she provided and felt it was compelling. He found that in most cases that he reviews the accountability piece is missing, but he felt that Peyton has hit the mark with taking accountability. Lawrence requested Peyton Stefan be removed from the batch to vote on separately.

Motion by Lawrence, second by Peckham to approve the Operator's License for Peyton Stefan. Motion carried 5-0.

Alfonso cautioned Ms. Peyton that the committee does not normally reverse the recommendation, so if she were to get arrested again her license could be revoked.

Motion by Lawrence, second by Peckham to approve or deny all the other licenses as recommended by staff. Motion carried 5-0.

Discussion and possible action regarding Ordinance Amending Section 9.08.020 Throwing or shooting of arrows, stones and other missiles prohibited

Rasmussen stated the City of Wausau has received negative press as a result of an erroneous media report from an outlet in Minnesota that picked up on a story regarding a city ordinance which includes snowballs in its list of projectiles. She noted the ordinance has been on the books since 1962. She wanted to have a discussion because this is the third time in the last 10 years this has made news. Calls have come in from all over the nation labeling Wausau the worst city in the country for outlawing snowball fights! She commented the video made by the Police Department and the Mayor posted on Facebook to correct the error was lighthearted and fantastic, but perhaps we should consider just removing "snowballs" from the list. It will have no effect on enforceability, but would mitigate the news cycle for the future. She noted, however, there was also support for leaving the ordinance unchanged.

Mayor Mielke addressed the committee regarding his frustration with this story and the fact that staff had to put up with verbal abuse and threats from people across the country in response to it. He congratulated the Police Department for the video on social media and indicated he was okay with whatever the committee decided to do.

McElhaney commented she did not like to appear to be governing by knee-jerk reactions. She personally did not care whether it was amended or not, but she did care about how it looks if it is removed. If it people were actually getting citations for having snowball fights in their yards or it was overused she would object, but that is not the case. She pointed out there are most likely many other old obscure ordinances that could be found and this felt a little bit knee-jerk to her.

Lawrence questioned if it would strengthen the ordinance to put in any language regarding objects thrown “resulting in bodily harm or property damage.” Alfonso responded the police want the ability to stop certain behavior *before* it actually results in harm or damage and this is a type of ordinance that allows them to do that.

Chief Bliven agreed the purpose of the ordinance is to ensure people can be held accountable for dangerous actions that don’t result in criminal damage. If there is a damage or injury component to it, then we’re talking about criminal statutes, which steps beyond the purpose of the ordinance to create a safe environment. He pointed to the example of sandbags being launched off the top of the parking ramp, or snowballs being thrown at a moving vehicle which could cause a crash. He commented if he had been asked two weeks ago to remove snowballs from the ordinance, even with all the media attention, he would have said no, but now that it is under discussion at committee he definitely felt it should be removed. This public discussion is going to make it a news story, so remove it and at the end of the day it changes nothing about how we enforce the ordinance. Alfonso agreed it would not impact their ability to enforce the ordinance. A projectile or missile includes any propelled object. She noted the police also have a level of discretion.

Rasmussen commented she did not want the city to go viral again, and if changing the ordinance stems that activity yet doesn’t impact in a negative way the ability to enforce or prosecute the ordinance, then she felt the word “snowball” should be removed. Herbst stated she felt the ordinance should be kept the way it is.

Motion by Peckham, second by Lawrence to approve Amending Section 9.08.020 to remove the word “snowball.” Motion carried 4-1. (*Herbst was the dissenting vote.*)

Operations Report from Fire Department for November 2019

Deputy Chief Barteck stated Thanksgiving marks the kick-off of their annual Keep the Wreath Green Program. The day after Thanksgiving there were a couple fires, one of which was significant enough that the wreath got its first red ball. He noted last year there were zero and the highest year there were eight. He reminded people when they bring a natural Christmas tree into the home, to be sure to water it regularly and to make sure it is good UL lighting.

Barteck commented with the snow comes medical calls from falls. He stated people should walk like a penguin outside on the snow and ice to keep from slipping and falling and to drive safe.

Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities

Chief Bliven presented the Tavern Report for November 1, 2019 through November 30, 2019 (*See attached*).

Chief Bliven indicated he spoke to Mike Felder about M&R Station regarding committee discussion the last two meetings about additional demerit points for their unwillingness to cooperate with law enforcement. He explained the violation for refusing to cooperate with the Police Chief or his designee is 75 points. He stated they did not feel this particular incident met the need to assess 75 points, however, they will continue to monitor as the reports indicate the owner has been intoxicated and is becoming confrontational with officers.

Rasmussen stated if this behavior continues he will be asked to appear before the committee, because we need our tavern owners to have a positive or at least a proactive relationship with law enforcement to run a safe premises. She did not feel it was fair to those establishments that do it right to let the ones that are not skate by without accountability. Bliven indicated he would have a meeting with the owner to make sure he understands the expectations of the committee. She stated it should be clear to him that the committee will be watching the reports and looking for that relationship to improve.

Chief Bliven stated he also had a meeting with New Chee Lor, owner of Newch’s, which is the former Chapter Two. There was a second incident where demerit points were issued to the establishment. He felt the discussion was very productive and Lor was seeking guidance and assistance to make sure these issues are not occurring.

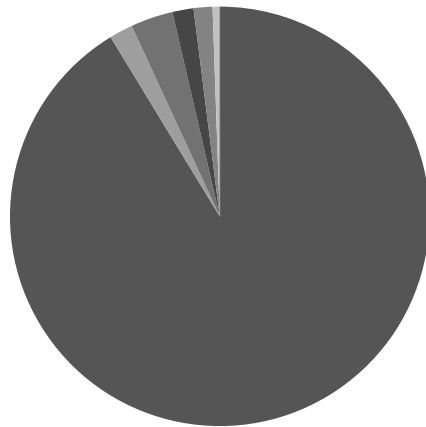
