To the Committee for Public Health and Safety,

March 4, 2020

My name is Bethany Stookey, and I am a Wausau resident living at 1614 Emerson St. It is my plan to acquire chickens this year, and while I am aware of the size restrictions regarding chicken coops, I am requesting consideration for a size variance.

According to my research, chickens that are not permitted to "free range" require a *minimum* of 10 square feet per bird in the run area, with 2-3 square feet per bird in the coop itself. Chickens that do not have adequate space are more prone to sickness, boredom, and aggression toward other flock-mates. Having lived on farms in the past, I understand the need for all creatures to have sufficient space so as to live as natural and comfortable of a life as possible.

While the current limit for a chicken coop is 4'x6', I am requesting permission to have a coop that is 5'x10' instead. I do not believe this is dramatically larger than what is currently allowed, but at the same time it will provide a better quality of life for the chickens in question.

I have been in touch with a Madison-based company that builds sturdy and aesthetically pleasing chicken coops, and I do not think the structure will negatively affect the visual appearance of our yard in any way. Please see attached picture for an example of how the coop will look.

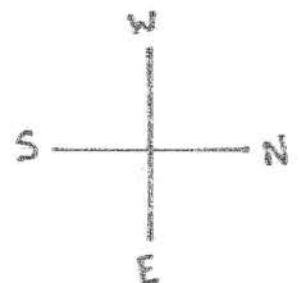
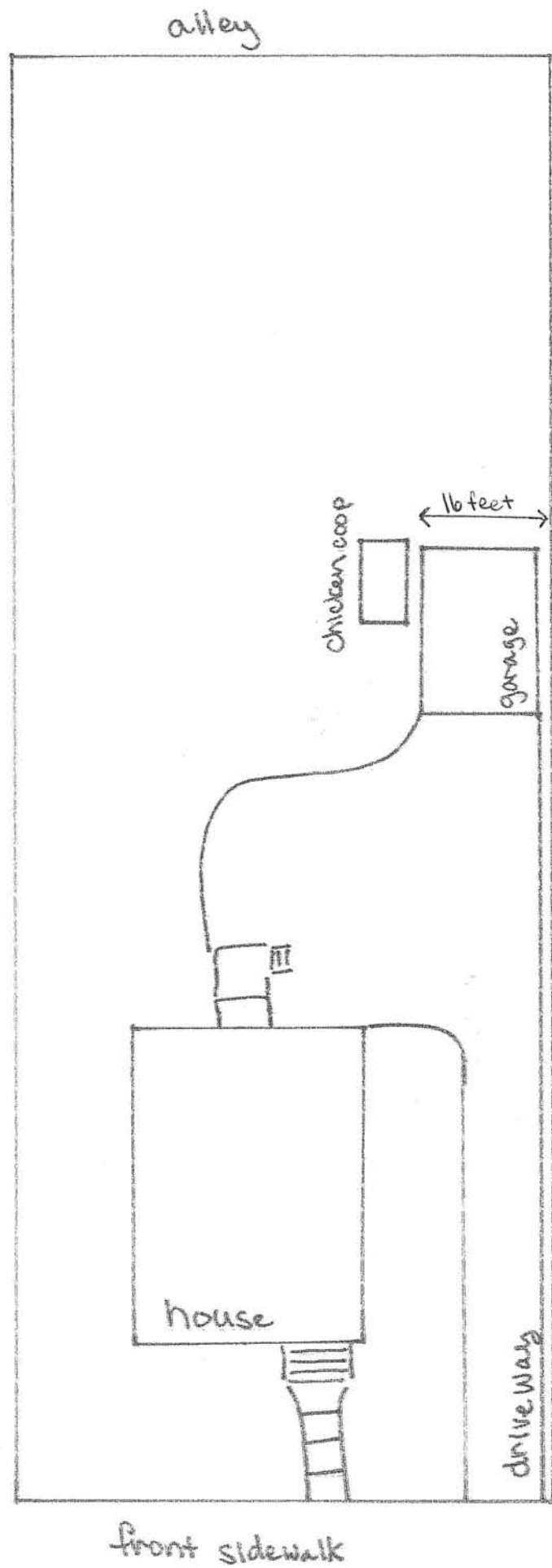
Furthermore, I have spoken with both our neighbors, neither of whom have any qualm with us having chickens, or providing a larger space with them, and have signed statements in that respect. I have recently met with the humane officer, Ashlee Bishop, to discuss coop placement, and she has agreed that a location behind our house and next to our garage is a good one, with low visibility to surrounding houses. Thank you very much for your consideration and aiding me in giving my chickens a happy life.

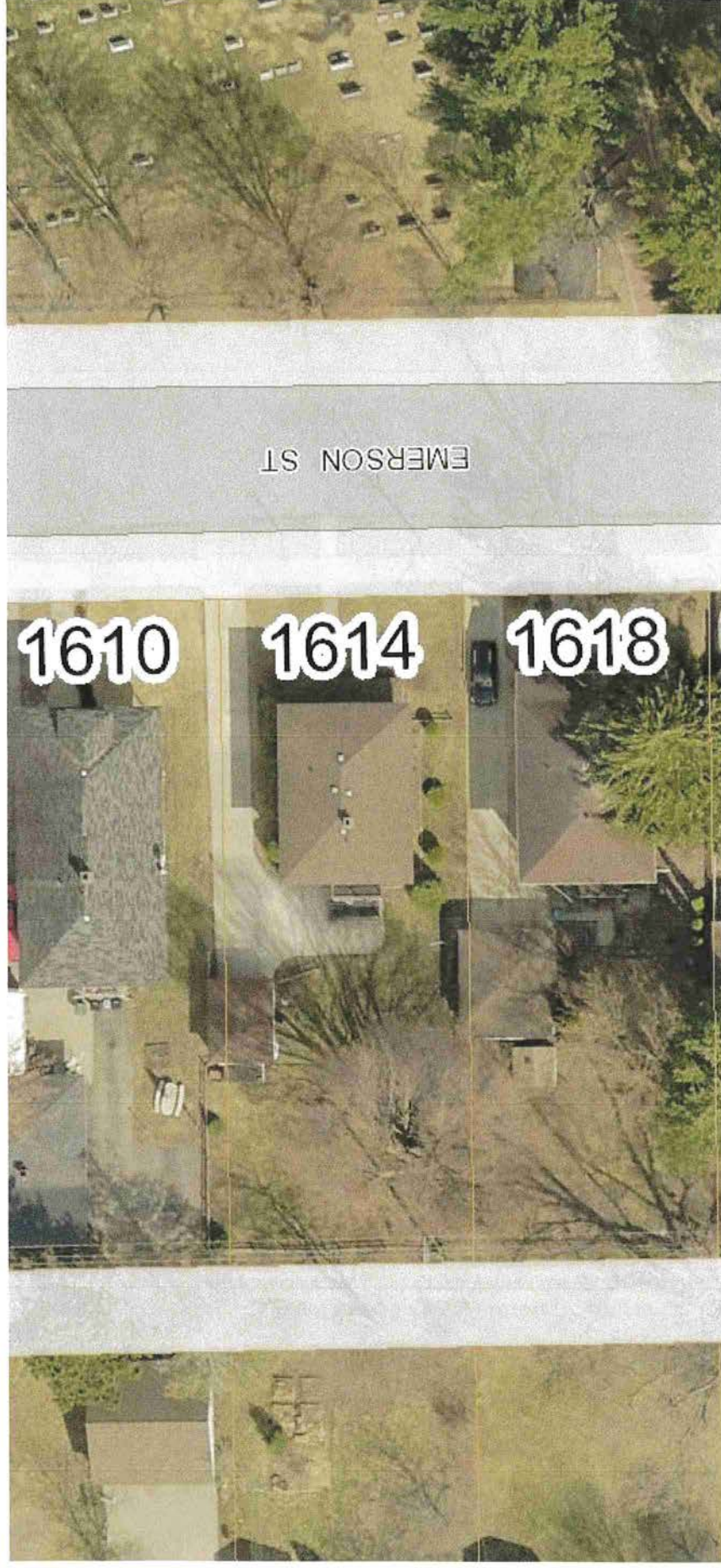

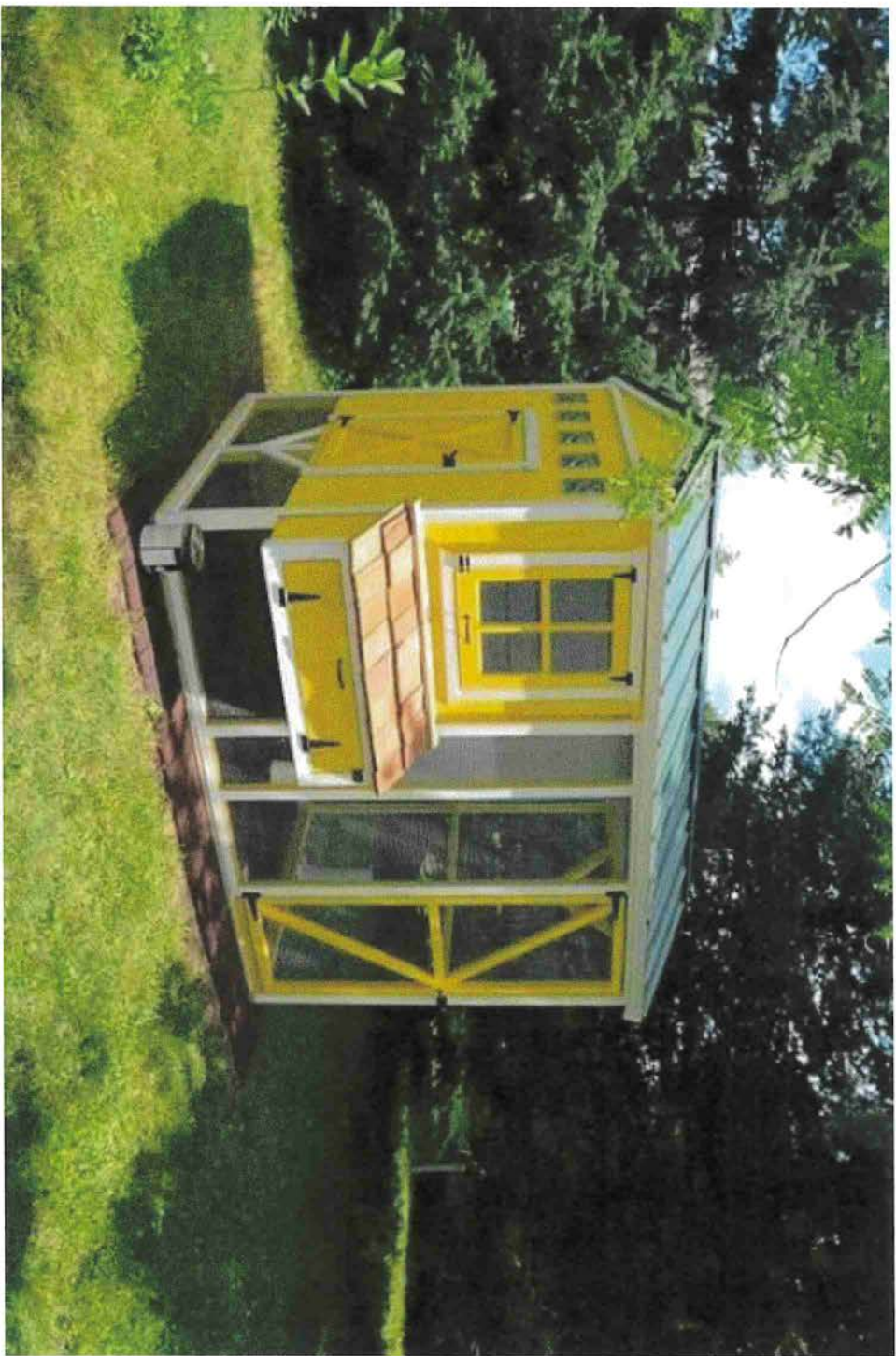

At this meeting, the Committee will be expecting dialogue from management and a summary of these particularly troublesome events. Please call my office at 715.261.6620 to confirm your planned attendance. Lastly, know that continued violations could result in non-renewal or revocation of your license.

NOTABLE INCIDENTS AT TAVERNS TO WHICH POLICE WERE DISPATCHED.

Roc's Place, 810 S. 3rd Avenue

- (1) *Case #20000168, 01/06/2020 at 1:04 AM:* A **bartender** called reporting that a male they had kicked out of the bar threatened to "strap up" and return with his gun. While Officers were responding, the caller reported that the male had returned. The workers had locked the doors, and were reporting that he was checking the front and back doors. Officers arrived and located the male after he had returned to his vehicle and was starting to leave. The male was arrested for OWI and Open Intoxicants, Disorderly Conduct and a Probation Violation. No weapon was located.
- (2) *Case #20000391, 01/12/2020 at 12:00 AM:* A refused caller reported hearing a gunshot outside and in front of Roc's Place bar. The caller did not see anyone that may have shot a gun. Officers observed someone leaving as they were arriving, and later located a shell casing at the location. Through interviews at the scene, a suspect was developed. That suspect was initially interviewed, and denied involvement. Investigators later observed surveillance video provided by bar management, and were able to observe the incident started with an altercation outside the bar. They were able to confirm their initial suspect had been the one to fire a gun. Contact was made with that suspect again some time later, and he was arrested.

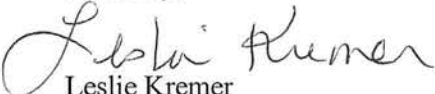

[SB 203](#) -- (now Act 166) Allows municipal governing bodies to delegate to the clerk or other appropriate official the authority to issue operator's (bartender's) licenses. This bill will speed up the time it takes for a person to obtain an operator's license and free up more time on the governing body's agenda for policy actions. The League thanks Sen. Kapenga (R-Delafield) and Rep. Knodl (R-Germantown) for introducing this bill.

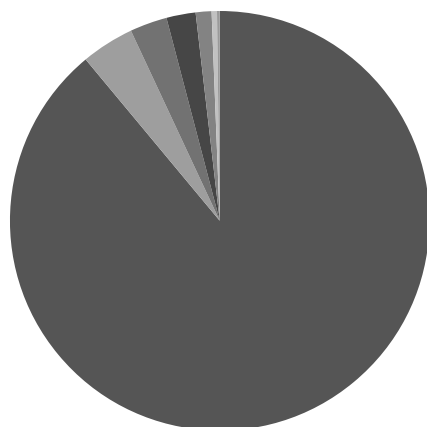

The worker did not necessarily need a report, but rather wanted to advise the Department of the sentiment in the message.

- (1) ****Officers have been conducting regular extra patrols at the establishment to ascertain whether or not it has been in operation. The last documented date of operation seems to have been 01/27/2020. ****

- (1) *Case #20001054, 02/02/2020 at 1:14 AM:* A **bar employee** called to report a fight involving five people, but no weapons. On arrival, Officers had difficulty obtaining information from people at the scene. Video was obtained, however it was at a later time. I reviewed the video, and there was a scuffle between the bartender and another woman. The other woman involved was not stopped or identified by Officer before she left hastily. One other male that was in the middle of the scuffle was stopped and found to have a warrant. He was arrested on the valid warrant. Another woman that was contacted lied about her identity, but was arrested for a probation violation. When her true identity was learned, she was still found to be on probation, and was arrested for the obstruction and a probation violation.
- (2) *Event #20023830, 02/23/2020 at 12:21 AM:* An ambulance was called after a woman was in the bar vomiting. She was described as being in and out of consciousness, had been served a drink, and fell off the bar stool after drinking only half of it. The bartender explained that the woman had arrived with a male named "Brian." Brian did not want to stay at the bar, so he left, leaving the woman behind. The woman admitted that she had been drinking with Brian throughout the day. She was transported to the hospital and would be released to a responsible person from the Emergency Department.

Treu's Tic Toc, 1201 W. Thomas Street

- (1) *Case #20001790, 02/22/2020 at 8:26 AM:* Officers responded to a commercial burglar alarm. On arrival, an employee was present and noted that they had a new alarm system installed and he didn't know it was active. A false alarm report was completed.



M & R Station, 818 S. 3rd Avenue

- (1) *Case #20001572, 02/16/2020 at 2:38 AM:* A cab driver called to report that there was an intoxicated driver that was trying to leave in her car from the parking lot. The caller stated that they were blocking the woman from leaving. Officers arrived and located the woman. She was arrested for OWI. The arresting Officer checked in the bar for the possibility of obtaining video evidence. The owner was contacted, and the Officer described him as being upset about the situation, calling the situation “bullshit.” He took the stance that he did not want to help prosecute the driver because she is a single mother of three. He admitted to watching the footage, and seeing the woman drive the car and forth while the cab had the car blocked in. He thought the cab driver had “set her up.” When the Officer repeatedly asked the owner for the footage, he told the Officer, “You already got her, what do you need the footage for?” From speaking with the owner, the Officer did not believe he would be able to obtain the footage voluntarily, and felt that the owner had a personal connection to the driver. I contacted the owner over the phone myself after hearing of the lack of cooperation. The owner reiterated that he would not be turning over the video “tonight,” as if it were too late, or he was in a state that he was unable to operate the equipment. Several members of the Department attempted to make arrangements to obtain the video. At one point, the owner was out of town for a family illness. It was ten days later that the owner brought a copy of the video to the Police Department. As a result of his initial reaction and refusal to cooperate with the Officer at the scene of the investigation, I recommend that **75 Demerit Points** be assessed for Refusal to Cooperate with Police Chief, or designee.
- (2) *Event #20025902, 02/27/2020 at 11:48 PM:* Two supervisors responded to the bar regarding some follow up investigation to a crash that had occurred. They confirmed that the suspect had been at the bar for a dart league. The had a discussion with the bartender on duty, reminding him of the ordinance prohibiting service to intoxicated persons, noting that the male that had crashed had given a preliminary breath test that was nearly three times the legal limit. They described the bartender as being very cooperative and thankful for the discussion.

Whiskey River Bar & Grill, 5512 Stewart Avenue

- (1) *Case #20001204, 02/06/2020 at 2:08 AM:* Officers responded to a commercial burglar alarm. They found the building secure. The bartender had just left and was not far away. She returned to let them into the building and check it. A false alarm report was completed.



101 Pub, 101 N. 3rd Avenue

Officers arrived and made contact with staff. The suspect had entered the bar, was swearing and not ordering anything. The bartender’s husband asked the male to leave. There were no charges at the time, but the suspect was advised not to return.
