Minutes of previous meeting. (3/21/22)

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the minutes. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications.

Lisa Rasmussen indicated all licenses and/or renewals were recommended for approval, there were no denial recommendations.

Motion by Herbst, second by Wadinski to approve the licenses as recommended by staff. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider request to hold "Pregame" Tailgate Party, May 31, 2022 (Pregame Pub, 2002 N 6th St) DNA Investment Properties, LLC

The manager from Pregame Pub explained the owners, Dan and Ashley Dadabo, want to re-introduce themselves to the community as a new bar. He noted he has worked with Ashley Dadabo for five and a half years at Milwaukee Burger Company. They want to explore supporting local community events/businesses with the Tailgate Party. The Woodchucks Athletic Park stadium is right around the corner, as well as pair with Zillman's Meat Market for the food. They would fence the parking lot area with ID checks at the entrance and are working with the Fire Department for the proper placement of grills. There will be designated areas for trash and recycling bins. He indicated they would like permission for outdoor music featuring different local artists between 4:30 to 6:30 pm prior to games. The neighbors will be notified of any music, and they will be ensured the music is temporary for the parking lot party. If this event goes well, they would like to look at future parties. Tickets will be given away at the Tailgate for a future Woodchucks game.

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the Tailgate Party to allow for alcohol and music in the parking lot on May 31, 2022. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider Central Business District Obstruction Permit (Oz Night Club, 320 Washington St)

Rasmussen stated Oz Bar would like to have tables outside on the sidewalk, but not for alcohol, noting no one was present to discuss the request. Mary Goede stated the owner, William Jones, indicated to her that he only wanted a place for patrons to go outside to smoke and that he did not intend to allow food or alcohol outside the bar. Rasmussen stated they will have to be careful to watch that patrons don't take their drinks outside with them.

Jim Wadinski questioned if the tables were to be right outside the front door of the establishment. Rasmussen stated the drawing shows it outside the front door on both sides of the planters on Washington Street.

Dawn Herbst felt tables were unnecessary for people stepping outside to smoke and that it would encourage people to take their drinks with them.

Wadinski suggested they table this until the owner could be present to answer questions. Rasmussen indicated he could be invited to the next meeting for discussion. Consensus of the committee was to defer action.

Discussion and possible action on request to amend Special Event Application for Dining in the Street (Wausau River District)

Rasmussen explained the request is to add dining on Saturday evenings to the already approved Wednesday evenings. There would be street closure and some outdoor music.

Motion by Wadinski, second by Peckham to approve the amendment. Motion carried 5-0.

Discussion and possible action on Resolution Designating the Month of May, 2022, as “No Mow May” and suspending enforcement of W.M.C. §6.48.010 Mowing Required and §6.48.040 Penalty from May 1, 2022 through May 31, 2022

Lisa Rasmussen stated the city participated in No Mow May last year and people had to put a sign in the yard to identify who was participating, however, it turned out to be a cumbersome process for the inspectors to manage. This year if the city participates, Inspections requested that we do so without the sign requirement.

Pat Peckham suggested if people kept their signs from last year, they could still put them out for the educational value of them. He agreed suspending enforcement for May will take away some of the confusion for the inspectors and relieve the burden of trying to get the signs into people’s hands. Rasmussen pointed out that it is not a requirement to participate in No Mow May, so if people want to continue to mow their lawns in May they can.

Motion by Wadinski, second by Herbst to approve the resolution designating the month of May as “No Mow May.”
Motion carried 5-0

Discussion and possible action on Resolution Urging state legislators to amend Wis. Stat. §125.17 to create a second tier of operator’s licenses or alternatively permit municipalities to place a restriction on the issuance of certain operator’s licenses that would limit sales to those at Class “A” and “Class A” establishments only, recognizing there is a distinction between businesses holding Class A licenses where alcohol beverage sales occur for off premise consumption only and businesses holding Class B licenses where sales and consumption occur on premises, such as bars, taverns and restaurants.

Rasmussen commented many times the committee has lamented the fact that we don’t have a server license that we can give to someone who just wants to work in a retail establishment, such as a grocery store, convenience store, or gas station. She explained the Operator’s license under state law can be used in either an on-premises consumption establishment, such as a tavern or a restaurant or it can be used to sell beverage to the public retail.

Rasmussen stated Pat Peckham contacted her about trying to change this and Becky McElhaney has also had some discussion with one of our state legislators, because we need and want people to be employed. There are jobs that need to be filled and people who want to work. The current law makes it difficult for the workforce who have no intention of tending bar, but work at a convenience store and cannot work alone without a license. This resolution asks our legislators to split the server license and give us the authority to either designate a license for retail only or create a type of serve license that is for retail only. She noted Tara Alfonso shared it with the League of Wisconsin Municipalities to have them support it and possibly other communities as well.

Tara Alfonso indicated she mentioned this question on a City Attorney conference call that the League formed. She found that many other communities have the same problem and are interested in it. She noted Claire Silverman of the League indicated she would pass on the resolution.

Becky McElhaney stated Representative Snyder was here last week and speaking with him he indicated that he understood the issue, has heard from others, and promises it will be taken up in January. She commented we have people that have background issues, but we want them to work to pay their fines and be rehabilitated, but we are saying no.

Rasmussen stated she hoped that at the state level, rather than try to create a separate type of license, which could take a long time, just take voting action to enable municipalities to manage this and put on a restriction of “retail only” in certain circumstances. She stated we should send it to all of legislators in Madison and encourage them take it up with deliberate speed.

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the resolution. Motion carried 5-0.

WFD 2021 Annual Report and Operations Report from Fire Department for March 2022

Rasmussen commented the annual report has great data and visual depictions that will be tool to help answer questions from the community and for the department to tell its story. Discussion followed.

Wausau PD Operations Report (1st Quarter, 2022) & Tavern Activities Report March 1, 2022 through March 31, 2022

Rasmussen questioned what was going on at Newch’s, which was assessed 100 demerit points, requiring a formal expression of concern letter be sent to bring the owner before the committee.

Chief Ben Bliven stated on March 20th Officers responded to Newch's on a report of a large fight, as well as a report of a firearm. There were some people there with evidence of injuries, evidence of improper serving, and the owner was not there. The employees were having a hard time reaching the owner who had been there during the fight but left prior to law enforcement arrival. An Officer spoke to him later and he explained he had to get some family members out of the building because he was concerned for their safety. He did not return until 6:00 AM when he called the department to turn over the video from the establishment. The video showed there was a firearm there and a fight.

Rasmussen noted the owner was called in before shortly after he was granted the license due to large parties, over capacity and fights. He had assured us at that time that large events would no longer be happening. She directed the Clerk to correspond with a formal expression of concern and invite him to the May meeting.

Chief Bliven stated in the first quarter they saw a lot of movement within the courthouse and court system which had stalled somewhat during the pandemic. Officers and detectives have been very busy attending court hearings and preparing for trials. Some big cases came to a conclusion with guilty pleas, including the homicide of Patti Grimm at the Pine Grove Cemetery in 2019 and two other homicides from 2018.

Bliven reported they have been inundated with complaints from businesses, downtown establishments, and citizens regarding the unhoused population. He indicated he has had meetings with Wipfli, Mark Craig (Compass Properties) at Washington Square, and the Library Director regarding citizen complaints of people sleeping, urinating, defecating, and having sexual intercourse in the ramps, as well as people aggressively panhandling. He commented it is a more significant issue than ever. He stated they are moving forward on some of the recommendations from the Police Task Force and have a job position justification for a Community Outreach Professional. We are working with Washington Square on trying to figure out how to fund a fulltime CSO for the downtown, patrol the parking ramps, and walk through the library. He felt it was important for the Council to be aware of this issue.

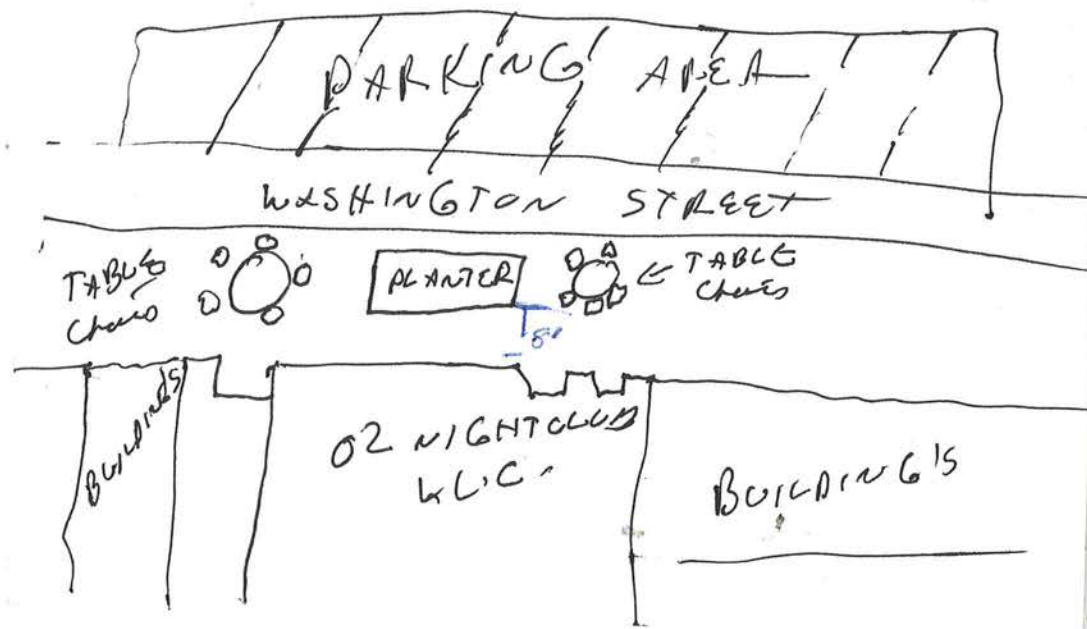

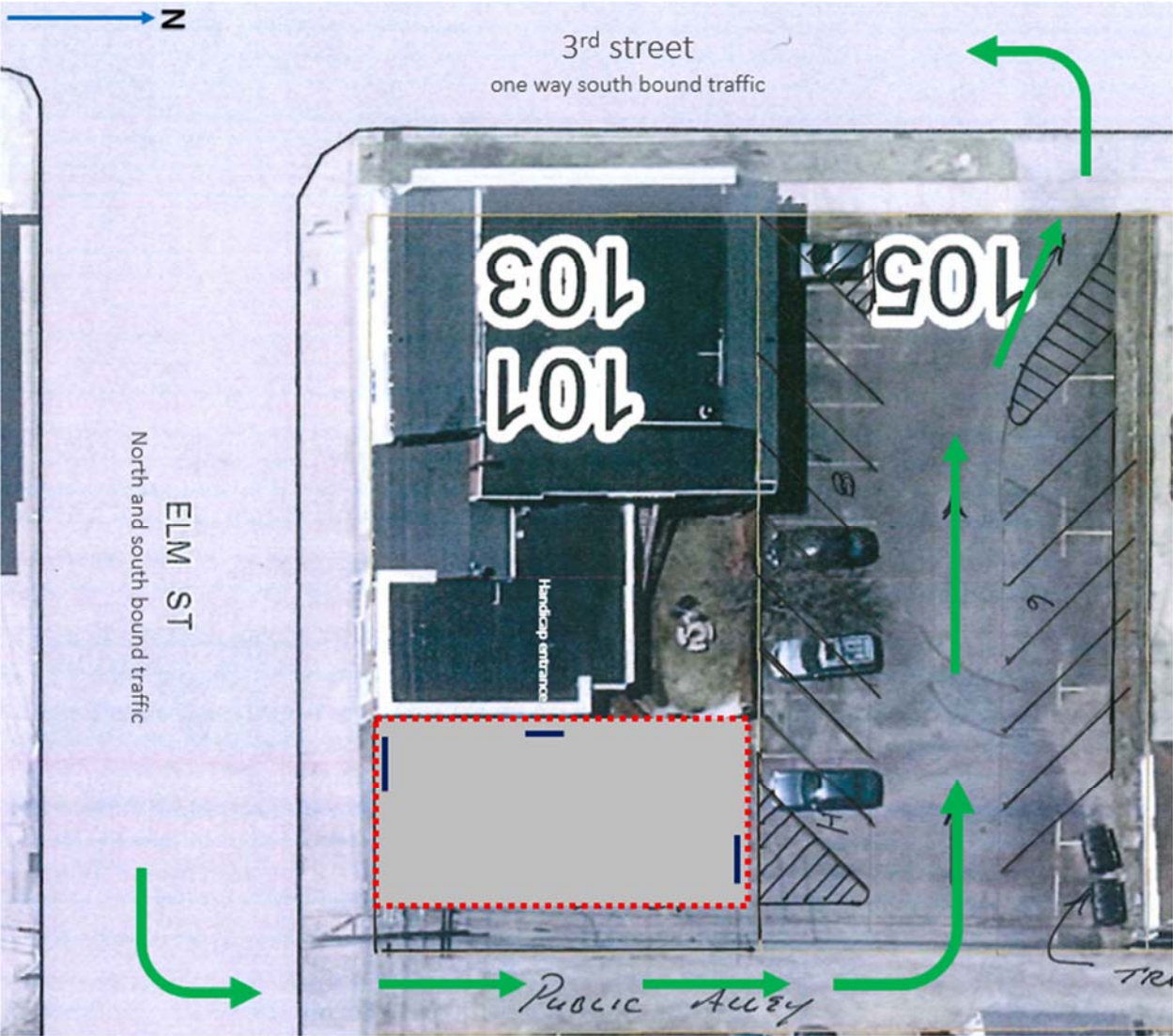

Purpose:

Various ordinance change to allow canopy over sidewalks greater than 7 feet.

Background:

Staff has been approached by Mark Craig to allow seasonal use canopies in the sidewalk areas of the central business district. Current ordinance allows up to 7 feet of intrusion over the right of way by a canopy per Wausau Municipal Code 12.44.040. The request is to allow canopies to cover the sidewalk areas to within 18 inches of the street curb by permit through public health and safety.

An ordinance change would also be required in WMC 5.63.060 to allow for canopies with support members to be placed in the sidewalk portion of the right of way. Current ordinance requires tables and chairs to be removed nightly. Assistant City Attorney Miller has drafted revisions for the committee to consider.

For Lemongrass, this would allow up to a 15-foot canopy to be placed over the sidewalk. This would allow customers to dine outside (along with their sidewalk café permit) during all types of weather. The canopy and its supports would remain in place seasonally, from May 1 to October 31st.

It should be noted that the zoning code does not allow for aluminum or suspended metal canopies in the downtown Historic Mixed Use (DHMU) district zoning per WMC 23.07.50. A good portion of the 300, 400 and 500 blocks of North 3rd Street are zoned Downtown Historic District. Washington Square portion of 300 N 3rd St is zoned Downtown Highrise Mixed Use (DRMU) District. So if the committee considers changing canopy protrusions in the right of way, it would be very limited to businesses along 3rd Street without changes to the zoning code.

Staff has included a zoning map for the area, a concept plan for Lemongrass, and examples from some businesses in the Milwaukee area.

Next Steps:

Consider recommending ordinance changes to allow larger canopies in the central business district.

Some considerations:

1. These changes would be limited along 3rd Street due to the historic zoning district prohibiting aluminum or suspended metal canopies.
2. Design standards / committee review standards. Milwaukee's design standard is 54 pages long.
3. Current ordinance allows for retractable awnings or canopies that extend into public right of way no more than 7 feet. Support structures can only be approved by Board of Public Works.
4. The Milwaukee examples are permanent and have a heavy built frame. Is that type of structure more desirable than a seasonal use canopy?

5.63.010 Intent and purpose.

The City of Wausau supports a vibrant central business district and recognizes the social and economic benefit in allowing certain activities to take place within the public right-of-way. Such uses include sidewalk cafes and other obstructions including, but not limited to self-supporting signs, sandwich board signs, canopies, works of art, planters, potted plants, statues, and other similar types of object. Specifically, the City finds and determines:

Section 2. That Section 5.63.020 Definitions is hereby amended to read as follows:

5.63.020 Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this chapter.

Canopy means a covering that is physically attached to the building's front façade and anchored to the ground, but is removed during the winter months from November 1 to April 30.

Section 3. That Section 5.63.030 Permit required is hereby amended to read as follows:

5.63.030 Permit required.

- (a) It is unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to erect, place, maintain, or operate on any public street or sidewalk or in any other public way in the central business district any sidewalk cafe, **canopy**, sign, work of art, planters, statues or other such obstruction without first having obtained a permit from the Public Health and Safety Committee of the Wausau Common Council.

Section 4. That Section 5.63.060 Sidewalk café standards is hereby amended to read as follows:

5.63.060 Sidewalk café standards.

The following standards, criteria, conditions and restrictions shall apply to all sidewalk cafes, provided, however, that the Director of Public Works or designee may impose additional conditions and restrictions to protect and promote the public health, safety, or welfare, to prevent a nuisance from developing or continuing, and to comply with this section, the City ordinances, and all applicable state and federal laws.

- (b) Tables, chairs, umbrellas or other fixtures in the sidewalk cafe:
- (1) Shall not block designated ingress, egress, or fire exits from or to the establishment of any other structure.

 - (1) Height of a canopy on the ground floor shall not extend below seven feet nor above 12 feet over the finished sidewalk level.
 - (2) ~~Canopies shall not extend over seven feet into the right-of-way.~~ However, canopies placed in front of a building's main entries may extend to within 18 inches of the building's side of the curbline providing the canopy is within the above height restrictions. Supporting members shall not be located within the right-of-way unless approved by the Board of Public Works.
 - (3) Canopies may be placed over the upper-story windows.

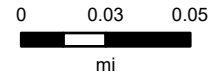




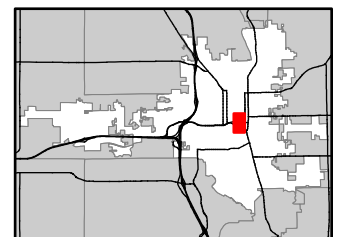

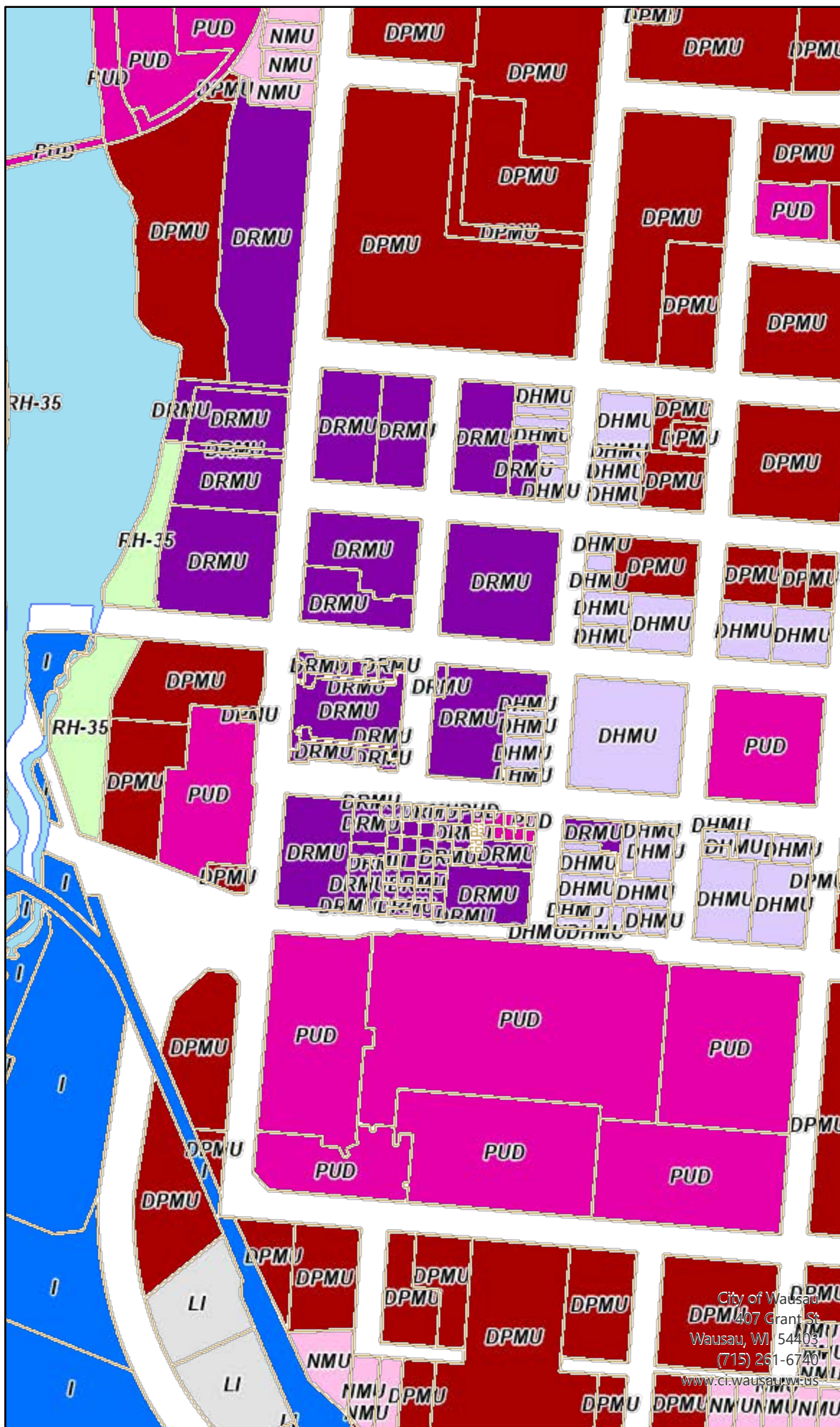

Re: Request to permanently amend Section 8.08.010 certain creatures forbidden
(subsection (d) Exceptions).

In 2021, the Public Health and Safety Committee as well as the City Council approved a temporary amendment to Section 8.08.010 certain creatures forbidden (subsection (d) Exceptions) for the Wausau/Marathon County Park, Recreation & Forestry Department to utilize goats on Barker Stewart Island to control Invasive Species. The invasive species on the island are very hardy and will continue to come back year after year. The utilization of goats grazing was researched and determined to be a method that is an alternative to chemical treatment and utilized by many communities.

In the summer of 2021 the PRF Department contracted with an area farmer to secure the use of goats for invasive vegetation management. This process was implemented in July of 2021. The 39 goats were present on Barker/Stewart Island for a period of approximately 3 weeks. Primary feeding consisted of invasive species such as honeysuckle and buckthorn. This feeding stressed the parent plant, however the feeding will need to be repeated to further address the abundance on invasives and manage rate of new growth.

The goats were contained to the north portion of the island (approximately 4 acres) with the use of an electric fence. Supplemental water and nutrients were provided by the farmers and park staff. The goats proved to sufficiently address the invasive plants and were also good to increase public awareness of the park. This location has never seen as many visitors as it did during the time frame in which the goats were present. It is anticipated that the park will continue to see increased use, which will also increase awareness of various bird species that inhabit the island. Utilizing the goats is also a way of educating the public about the use of goats and about invasive species. The PRF Department would continue to hold a one day special event near the island or on the 400 Block. The event may include a few goats that the public could touch and see up close. The farmers would be present for this event.

Staff has already been in contact with the farmer and the goats are available to return to the island again in July 2022. It is recommended that we continue to utilize the goats to control invasive species on the island and it may take a few years, we are therefore requesting for the change to Section 8.08.010 certain creatures forbidden (subsection (d) Exceptions) be a permanent change. This will allow staff to continue this effort without coming back to the PH&S and City Council each year.

Section 1. That Section 8.08.010 Certain creatures forbidden, is hereby amended to read as follows:

8.08.010 Certain Creatures forbidden. (a) Wild Animals. It is unlawful for any person to keep, maintain or have in his or her possession or under his or her control within the city any dangerous or wild animal, insect or reptile, or any other animal or reptile of wild, vicious or dangerous propensities. The prohibition of this subsection shall include any of the following animals, reptiles, or insects whether bred in the wild or in captivity, and also any of their hybrids with domestic species listed herein. The animals, reptiles or insects listed in parentheses are intended to act as examples and are not to be construed as an exhaustive list or limit the generality of each group of animals, unless otherwise specified.

...

(d) Exceptions.

...

(2) The prohibitions in subsections (b) and (c) do not apply to farm animals where such farm animals/poultry are part of agricultural fairs, shows or sales of farm animals/poultry sponsored by an agricultural organization which occur at Marathon Park and are no longer than seven days in duration; farm animals/poultry on a display for judging purposes; or a horse, pony, mule or other beast of burden in connection with a horse-drawn carriage licensed under Chapter 5.74 of the Wausau Municipal Code.

(3) The prohibitions in subsections (b) and (c) do not apply to the use of goats by the City of Wausau/Marathon County Parks, Recreation, Forestry Department utilized for vegetation control or abatement purposes within City parks.

(4) The prohibitions in subsections (b) and (c) do not apply to the display of farm animals by the City of Wausau/Marathon County Parks, Recreation, Forestry Department within a City park or on the 400 Block as part of a short term event hosted or sponsored by the department of one day or less.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the day after its publication.

I. PURPOSE

Title II of the American's with Disabilities Act (ADA) prohibits discrimination against qualified individuals with disabilities in all programs, activities, and services of public entities. Therefore, this policy outlines the provisions of Title II of the ADA, and the rights and obligations of citizens and the City under federal and state law.

II. POLICY

It is the policy of the City of Wausau to ensure that all citizens have an equal opportunity to participate in and receive the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of the City of Wausau. This will be done in the most integrated setting appropriate to the needs of the qualified individual with a disability. Only where it is absolutely necessary will the City provide services, programs, or activities separately to persons with disabilities. No qualified individual with a disability shall, on the basis of said disability, be screened out of a service, program or activity. Nor, shall any individual be excluded from participation in or denied the benefits of said services, programs or activities, because of their disability.

The City is required to ensure all programs and activities are accessible, but are not required to make each and every facility accessible, as long as all programs are accessible (see "**Transition Plans**"). There are several means by which the City can make its programs readily accessible to and usable by disabled individuals, including:

- Redesigning equipment;
- Reassigning services or programs to alternative, accessible buildings;
- Assigning aides to beneficiaries;
- Providing auxiliary aids;
- Making home visits; or
- Altering existing facilities or building new facilities;

The City of Wausau is required to reasonably modify City-wide policies, practices, or procedures to avoid discrimination. However, modifications may not be required where a particular modification would fundamentally alter the nature of the service, program or activity.

a. Reasonable Accommodation

If a reasonable accommodation is necessary to participate in the services provided by the City of Wausau please contact: the ADA Coordinator, City Hall, 407 Grant Street, Wausau, Wisconsin 54403, 715-261-6590. Every attempt will be made to accommodate the request.

i. Due Process

The following procedure is intended to protect the rights of interested individuals to meet appropriate due process standards and to assure that the City of Wausau complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the implementation regulations.

ii. Complaint Procedure

If anyone utilizing the City's facilities, programs, services or activities believes they have been discriminated against on the basis of a disability in connection with access to any City facility or programs, services or activities, they have the right to file a complaint. Complaints should be addressed to ADA Coordinator, City Hall, 407 Grant Street, Wausau, Wisconsin 54403, 715-261-6590, who has been designated to coordinate ADA compliance efforts.

1. A complaint should be filed in writing, utilizing the City's Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) Accommodation Complaint, contain the address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation.
2. A complaint should be filed as soon as possible but no later than 60 calendar days after the alleged violation.
3. An investigation, as appropriate, shall follow a complaint filing. The investigation shall be conducted by the ADA Coordinator or its designee, and afford all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint.
4. A written response to the complaint, and a description of the resolution, if any, shall be issued by the ADA Coordinator and a copy forwarded to the complainant no later than 30 calendar days after its filing.
5. The ADA Coordinator will retain the files and records of all ADA complaints filed with the City, for at least three years.
6. The complainant can request a review of the written response issued by the ADA Coordinator, by making such a request within 15 days of the date of issuance to the ADA Coordinator. If made to any other city officer, employee, head of city agency, committee, board or commission, such individual shall be responsible for timely transmission of requests for appeal to the city clerk, in accordance with Wausau Municipal Code 2.21.070. Such appeal request shall then be heard by the Administrative Review Appeals Board, in accordance with Wausau Municipal Code 2.21.040, which provides administrative review of municipal determinations.
7. The right of an individual to a prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint filed with the City shall not be impaired by the individual's pursuit of other remedies such as the filing of an ADA complaint with the responsible federal department or agency.

b. Self Evaluation

The City is required to conduct a ***self evaluation***, which includes a comprehensive review of current policies and practices (formal written policies and procedures and actual operating practices). Any policy or practice that does not comply with the requirements of Title II must be identified and modified to bring the policy or practice into compliance. Individuals must be provided the opportunity to submit comments pertaining to the City's effort.

c. Transition Plan

When structural modifications to facilities are necessary in order to make a program, service, or activity accessible to people with disabilities, the City is required to develop a facility transition plan, which must include:

- The physical barriers which limit access to and use of the programs, services, and activities for people with disabilities, including communications features which are structural in nature;
- A detailed description of how the City plans to make the facilities accessible;
- The schedule for barrier removal;
- A yearly schedule, if the transition plan is more than one year long; and
- The name of the individual who is responsible for implementing the transition plan;

The City is required to maintain in operable working condition those features of facilities and equipment that are required to be readily accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities. This includes locked accessible doors, elevators, accessible routes which are obstructed by parked cars or furniture, and complaint signage which is obstructed from vision and touch. This Transition Plan was completed in October 2019 by Accessibility Consultation and Training Services, Inc. The City is currently working through the list of physical barriers and meets quarterly to monitor progress.

- By January 26, 1993, public entities must perform a self-evaluation of their current services, policies and practices and the effects thereof that do not or may not meet the requirements of Title II, and make necessary modifications;
- Public entities must provide notice to applicants, participants and beneficiaries of their services, programs or activities, regarding the requirements of Title II and its applicability to their services, programs or activities;
- Public entities employing 50 or more persons must designate at least one employee to coordinate its efforts to comply with Title II, including investigation of complaints alleging noncompliance on the part of the public entity;
- Public entities employing 50 or more persons must adopt and publish a grievance procedure providing for the prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging action prohibited by Title II; and

WHEREAS, as part of the City's 2017-2019 Work Plan with its insurer, Cities and Villages Mutual Insurance Company, 2017 Service Activities identified in partnership with them, included Facility Safety Inspections, and ADA Title II Evaluations; and

WHEREAS, an internal team was assembled, representing various departments, that began meeting August 4, 2017 and continues to meet quarterly to review progress on the self-evaluation of the City's services and properties, programs and activities, and to identify and assign responsibility for various items needing action; and

WHEREAS, an ADA Policy, Notice, Grievance Procedure, Accommodation Request Form, and Complaint Form had been created for consideration by the full Council and was approved at its April 10, 2018 Common Council Meeting; and

WHEREAS, your Public Health & Safety Committee, at their May 16, 2022 meeting, recommended the updates outlined in the attached documents (Title II Policy, Accommodation Request Form, Notice, Grievance Procedure, and Complaint Form);

City of Wausau Grievance Procedure Under The Americans with Disabilities Act

This Grievance Procedure is established to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"). It may be used by anyone who wishes to file a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of disability in the provision of services, activities, programs, or benefits by the **City of Wausau**. The City of Wausau Employee Handbook governs employment-related complaints of disability discrimination.

The complaint should be in writing and contain information about the alleged discrimination such as name, address, phone number of complainant and location, date, and description of the problem. Alternative means of filing complaints, such as personal interview or a tape recording of the complaint, will be made available for persons with disabilities upon request.

The complaint should be submitted by the grievant and/or his/her designee as soon as possible but no later than 60 calendar days after the alleged violation to:

Upon receipt of the complaint, the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee will conduct an investigation and afford all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint. Within 30 calendar days of the filing of the complaint, the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee will respond to the complainant in writing, and where appropriate, in a format accessible to the complainant, such as large print, Braille, or audio tape. The response will explain the position of the **City of Wausau** and offer options for substantive resolution of the complaint.

If the response by the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee does not satisfactorily resolve the issue, the complainant and/or his/her designee may appeal the decision to the ADA Coordinator within 15 calendar days from issuance of the determination response. If made to any other city officer, employee, head of city agency, committee, board or commission, such individual shall be responsible for timely transmission of requests for appeal to the city clerk, in accordance with Wausau Municipal Code 2.21.070. Such appeal request shall then be heard by the Administrative Review Appeals Board, in accordance with Wausau Municipal Code 2.21.040, which provides administrative review of municipal determinations.

All written complaints received by the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee, appeals to the Administrative Review Appeals Board, and responses from both will be retained by the **City of Wausau** for at least three years.

NOTICE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

In accordance with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"), the **City of Wausau** will not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities on the basis of disability in its services, programs, or activities.

Employment: The **City of Wausau** does not discriminate on the basis of disability in its hiring or employment practices and complies with all regulations promulgated by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission under Title I of the ADA.

Effective Communication: The **City of Wausau** will generally, upon request, provide appropriate aids and services leading to effective communication for qualified persons with disabilities so they can participate equally in the **City of Wausau's** programs, services, and activities, including qualified sign language interpreters, documents in Braille, and other ways of making information and communications accessible to people who have speech, hearing, or vision impairments.

Modifications to Policies and Procedures: The **City of Wausau** will make all reasonable modifications to policies and programs to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy all of its programs, services, and activities. For example, individuals with service animals are welcomed in **City of Wausau** offices, even where pets are generally prohibited.

Anyone who requires an auxiliary aid or service for effective communication, or a modification of policies or procedures to participate in a program, service, or activity of the **City of Wausau**, should contact the **ADA Coordinator, City Hall, 407 Grant Street, Wausau, Wisconsin 54403, 715-261-6590** as soon as possible but no later than 48 hours before the scheduled event.

The ADA does not require the **City of Wausau** to take any action that would fundamentally alter the nature of its programs or services, or impose an undue financial or administrative burden.

The **City of Wausau** will not place a surcharge on a particular individual with a disability or any group of individuals with disabilities to cover the cost of providing auxiliary aids/services or reasonable modifications of policy, such as retrieving items from locations that are open to the public but are not accessible to persons who use wheelchairs.

Fire Chief Report by Robert Barteck

Welcome new Council Members! I hope you find the Fire Department's monthly report educational and informational. Please reach out to me if you have any questions or want more details on any data or topics.

The April monthly report highlights some exciting topics. EMS Division Chief Jared Thompson highlights paramedic training related to pediatric patients and an interesting EMS call. Deputy Chief Jeremy Kopp shares a story of how crews recently successfully saved pets from a house fire. Training Division Chief Dave Briggs shares how we use lessons learned from a line of duty death to be better firefighters. He also shares experiences attending the largest firefighter's conference in the world. And Fire Marshal Brian Stahl discusses fire prevention education efforts and the dangers of smoke in the home.

For my Fire Chief report, I would like to discuss the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) fund requests that I submitted to the Finance Committee and were addressed in the April 26th meeting. The city has received 15.6 million dollars from ARPA. It is in determining the best way for the city to spend the money to have the most significant positive impact on the community, which is no easy task. I submitted two requests to use these funds on behalf of the fire department.

Additional Firefighter/Paramedics:

In November of 2021, I made a presentation to the Common Council that highlighted the difficulties the department is experiencing related to 50 years of stagnant staffing levels and increasing call volume. Here are a few quick bullet points on the topic:

- 1970 was the last time the fire department increased staffing.
- 1970 to 2022, call volume has tripled.
- 1970 to 2022, the department has added many services, including Paramedic level EMS transport coverage which is now 90% of the department's workload.
- November 8, 2021, I presented the staffing problems the department is facing to the Common Council.
- November 15, 2021, the Public Health and Safety Committee unanimously approved hiring at least nine additional firefighter/paramedics.
- December 13, 2021, the Human Resources examined the deployment models and unanimously approved hiring 12 additional Firefighter/Paramedics
- January 11, 2022, the Finance Committee took up the funding of the firefighter/paramedics. The committee unanimously approved the Fire Chief to apply for a Staffing for Effective Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant for 9 of the 12 positions. The committee tabled the discussion on funding the remaining three positions until a later date.
- February 3, 2022, I submitted the SAFER Grant to FEMA.
- April 26, 2022, I submitted a request to the Finance Committee for \$700,000 of ARPA funding to pay for 3 of the additional firefighter/paramedic positions for the first 2.5 years. The Committee will now rank and consider the request at future meetings.

The future of the additional firefighter/paramedic positions will require funding allocation from the Finance Committee before the topic can move to the Common Council. If the SAFER Grant funding request is unsuccessful, the Finance Committee will need to create a contingency plan for funding all 12 of the positions.

Station One Replacement Land Acquisition:

On April 26, 2022, I proposed to the Finance Committee to use \$815,000 of ARPA funds to purchase the property located at 811 & 813 Grand Ave, on Floral Ln and Grand Ave. Commonly referred to as the Flower Shop Property because Wausau Floral conducted business there for 40+ years. This 2.19-acre lot has long been identified as the best option to move Fire Station One to eventually.

During the 2015 assessment of all three fire stations, Station Two and Station One were identified as needing to be replaced. Being the higher priority, Station Two was replaced with a small outlying station on land the city already owned with no room for administrative offices. Station One has received some repairs to keep the station functional for a few more years but has reached the end of its life span as a fire station. It needs to receive a complete remodel and rebuild or be replaced. With the Wausau Police Department busting at the seams for space, it makes the best sense for the city to begin planning to replace Fire Station One. This project will take several years to accomplish. The planning and land acquisition need to start immediately to be prepared for the future.

The 2015 response time studies completed determined that Station One is near the perfect location for a timely response within its response district. Station One needs to be along the Grand Avenue corridor with access to the Thomas Street bridge to ensure equally fast response times to all the neighborhoods within its district. Unfortunately, there is only one parcel of vacant property within that area, the flower shop property. The purchase of the property will be long-range cost savings for the community because it will not have to pay for properties that have homes or businesses on it and then tear down those structures to build the fire station.

While the \$815,000 price for the flower shop property sounds high, the City Assessor Rick Rubow has informed me that property in this city area sells for \$7 to \$9 per sq foot. The \$815,000 equates to \$8.67 per sq foot, which falls within the fair market price. The property is on the open market and could be sold before the city can acquire the parcel, forcing the city to purchase homes or businesses in the Grand Ave/Thomas St area. The topic will be discussed again at the May 10 Finance Committee meeting.

To assist us with good data about why the station needs to be replaced, I have asked Five Bugles Design to refresh their analysis of Station One in 2015 and conduct a complete evaluation of the station. They will have their team of engineers conduct inspections of the station's infrastructure and conduct a long-term usage study of the station. The report from Five Bugles Design is expected in late June.

EMS Division by EMS Division Chief Jared Thompson

April was an action and rewarding packed month for the EMS Division:

Training

The EMS Division was able to send 4 of our firefighter/paramedics to the American Heart Association Instructor classes for Pediatric Advanced Life Support, Advanced Cardiac Life Support, and Basic Life Support at Northcentral Technical College. All three of these classes were eight hours in length and are designed to prepare the participant to teach the class. Having additional instructors in our department helps us to meet the certifications that are required to stay current with our EMT and Paramedic licensures. This is the first time in department history that we will have a strong American Heart Association Instructor certification presence.

For the month of April, the EMS Division focused its monthly training on the pediatric population. The crews were presented with a 6-year-old male patient suffering from a severe asthma attack that did not respond to our advanced life support medications. The crews were expected to identify the medical emergency and treat the patient per our EMS protocols. There were a lot of good teaching moments and crew bonding as well. All paramedics and EMTs did an outstanding job and are ready to treat our pediatric population in the Wausau area.



Grant

The EMS Division is happy to report that it received a \$3,000.00 grant from the North Central Wisconsin Healthcare Emergency Readiness Coalition. The mission of the North Central Wisconsin Healthcare Emergency Readiness Coalition (NCW HERC) is to increase collaboration, communication, and readiness across our region's public and private health care providers and their community partners for emergencies, events, and unplanned incidents. This grant money is designed to assist and offset the increase in personal protective equipment (PPE) costs. We were very happy to receive this grant because on every medical emergency that our crew members respond to, PPE is utilized.

Call of the Month

On April 6th, crews from Station 1 responded to a local business on Grand Avenue. Information from our dispatch was that a worker had collapsed, and that CPR was in progress. Upon our crew's arrival, they immediately initiated our cardiac arrest treatment protocols. The crew defibrillated their patient once and then assessed that a pulse was present. The crews quickly performed a 12-lead ECG and transmitted it to Aspirus Wausau Hospital. With the ECG that was transmitted, the hospital was able to activate the catheterization lab (cath lab) team and cardiologists. As the crew arrived at the hospital, they were able to take their patient directly to the cath lab so the cardiologist could open the occluded heart vessel. This patient was a truck driver from Iowa who was delivering building supplies. The patient is expected to make a full recovery.

Fire Training Division by Training Division Chief David Briggs

Let us face it, we train a lot. Local, State, and National guidelines help us to form our training plan for the given year. However, what we do to meet those standards varies greatly. In April, we started the month off with a firefighter Line of Duty Death (LODD) case study to honor the memory of the fallen and learn from the root cause of his death. We then work on knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA) to prepare for the rigors of the profession.

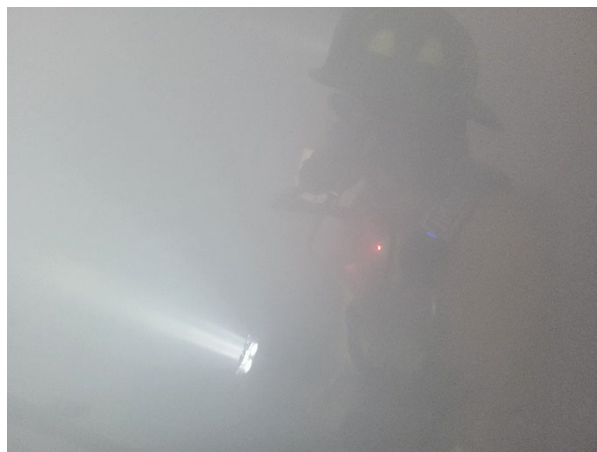
LODD Brian Carey



In the case of Brian Carey, a firefighter from Illinois, many issues were identified in the independent investigation surrounding the circumstances of his death. The report outlines issues such as a lack of a complete "scene size-up," poor communications, lack of incident command, and lack of orientation contributed to his demise. To honor him and ensure his death was not in vain, we trained on concepts related to these findings.

Nearly every drill we perform includes aspects of fire-ground communication. Hose drills, scene size-ups, and building/room orientation drills, all include communication on what we see, where we are, and what we need. Without practicing these concepts, we will not be able to perform to a high degree on a scene.

Building/Room Orientation





In the photos above, the crew performed a scene size-up of a building with “smoke showing,” created an initial action plan, and implemented their plan to mitigate an incident and rescue a victim. The drill included orienting to the structure from the exterior by looking at the construction type, the door and window locations, and any outcroppings or additions readily visible. Upon entry, the crew can move as fast or as slow as the scene dictates.

Many buildings are well sealed for energy efficiency. These types of structures hold in heat and smoke until the fire progresses so severely that it burns through or breaks the windows. Until the fire is vented, the smoke may be so thick and disorienting, that flashlights are of little to no help, and we must physically orient ourselves to the structure by feel while searching for victims. Some fires “self-vent” through the roof, doors, or windows and the smoke begins to “lift” and visibility improves. These fires grow exponentially and require us to move even faster to put the fire out and conduct a search.

NFPA 1410 #2



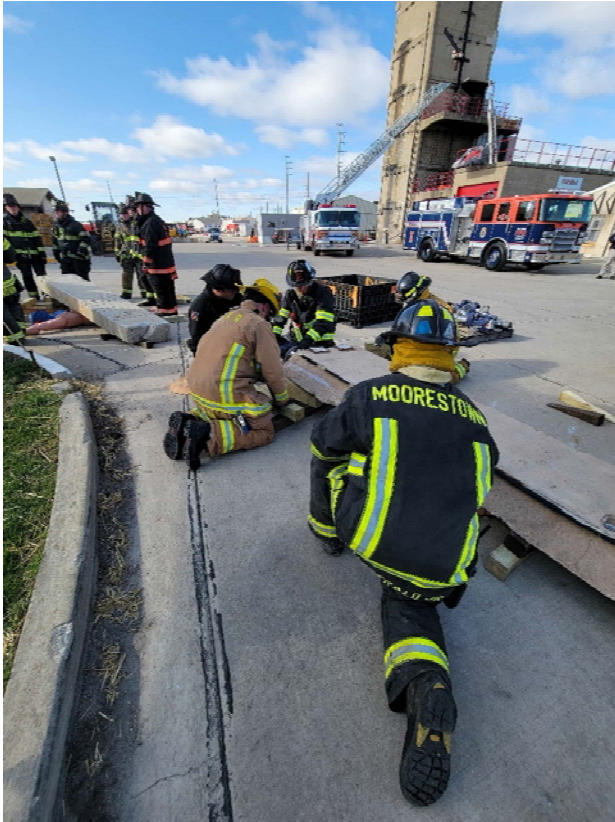
Throughout the year, we perform NFPA 1410 drills. These assessment style drills are outlined by the National Fire Protection Association to measure our performance to a timed national standard. Above, the crew had to hook a hydrant, lay a supply line from the hydrant, and deploy specific hose lines in a specific time. As you can see, these activities are very labor intensive, and they require enough personnel to perform them. If the ambulance is on an EMS call, we are unable to effectively complete the drill in the standard time. The scary thing about this is that these drills and assessments are directly based on fireground suppression activities like at a house fire.

Hose Testing

While testing fire hose to ensure it does not pop when we pressurize it is more of an activity, we train on the proper methods and equipment every year before and during the time-consuming task. With thousands of feet of hose in the Wausau Fire Department, we must ensure we test is properly to ensure it is safe and it performs when we need it to. Another opportunity hose testing creates for us is the function of deploying and

re-loading hose on the apparatus. Each evolution of performing a hose lay and repacking improves our skill and efficiency.

Fire Department Instructor's Conference (FDIC)



April 24-29 was a long week for Training Division Chief Briggs. He attended the largest firefighter conference and tradeshow in the world, in Indianapolis, Indiana. To begin the week, he attended "RIT Under Fire" hosted and taught by the Illinois Fire Service Institute (IFSI). This truly grueling class started at 5:45 AM with a 2-hour bus ride that included lectures, videos, and equipment displays on the way. Once at IFSI, the pace never slowed from the moment of arrival to the moment the bus boarded to drive back to Indianapolis.

IFSI on-skills included: lifting concrete slabs and "debris" off collapse victims, Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) pack deployment to supply breathing air, forcible entry, search and rescue, victim drags and movement, ladder rescues, breaching through cinder block walls with hand tools, and more.

Over half of the day's training was conducted with actual fires in training structures with heavy smoke conditions. The "heavy" smoke conditions were so thick during the drills, that TDC Briggs and his crew had to crawl so low that their helmet eye shields were nearly scraping the floors just to search below the smoke for

victims. Ultimately, there was no better feeling for these participants than to hear from their instructors that they were the only group to successfully rescue all victims in the scenario.

RIT Under Fire concluded with a 2-hour bus ride back to Indianapolis from IFSI. On the bus, members of the instructor cadre debriefed the participants on the lessons learned, methods to “tighten up” tactics, and other collaboration on best practices.

The rest of the week included lectures from leading fire-service experts on search and rescue, performing live-fire training, fire scene tactical priorities, aerial operations, and more. TDC Briggs returned with nearly 2 dozen pages of notes and numerous contact cards with the intent to weave in lessons learned into upcoming training for the WFD.

Each lesson learned was paired with the consideration of how we operate in central Wisconsin. While we are very good at what we do, there are always tidbits of information gained, and skills to add to our mental toolbox.

Not every moment of the conference was spent in the classroom. The end of the conference includes one of the largest fire/rescue/EMS tradeshow in North America. Some time was spent learning about new equipment, technology, and methodology pertaining to everything from small hand tools to multi-million-dollar apparatus and equipment. Conferences in Wisconsin provide the opportunity to speak with vendors about new and emerging technology in the profession; however, they are not even comparable to what is available at FDIC.

Gaining new perspective in hands on training, classroom sessions, and the trade show is essential to learning and growing in any profession. FDIC simply provides one of the best platforms for fire and EMS educators to soak it up in a very short period and prepare to disseminate the information upon return to their home organizations.

Fire Prevention Division by Fire Marshal Brian Stahl

Inspections: Within the City of Wausau for the month of April, we performed 505 total inspections. We had 62 properties that had Fire Code Violations. These properties will require follow up inspections to confirm compliance. We conducted 2 consultation inspections on new construction sites. One was for a final Occupancy Inspection and Alarm system testing; the other was for a new sprinkler system.

Investigations: The prevention Division conducted a total of one Fire Investigation throughout April. This was a residential duplex rental property.

Public Outreach: Our Public outreach programs for April consisted of two Smoke Detector and CO detector installations. We installed a total of three smoke detectors and two CO alarms.

Education: During the Covid pandemic, there was a joint decision between the Wausau Fire Dept. and the Wausau School District. This decision was to suspend the “in-school” department participation for the annual Fire Safety programs. This has always been scheduled for the month of October when Fire Prevention Week is scheduled nationally. Over the last two years we have provided Flash drives to every school (15 schools) in our district that we would have attended. The Flash drives contain educational resources like videos and interactive websites to the schools that could be distributed to the classes. With the severest Covid restrictions now being lifted, we are in the beginning stages of revamping our Fire Safety School programs for this October. The 5th Grade content had been re-done in 2018, what we will need to look at the 1st and 3rd grade content. We are hoping to design a streamlined class that would still educate these two demographics with the applicable knowledge required.

Fire Operations Division by Deputy Chief Jeremy Kopp

April is supposed to bring spring, but it seems to have tricked us and felt more like winter to most of us. We did see some rain and a lot of melt off which caused high water in the area and some dangerous conditions. Crews were on high alert and fortunately we were able to see water conditions go back to normal without any life-threatening situations.

Significant calls: WFD responded to 3 building fires, 3 cooking fires, and one grass fire in the month of April. On the 16th of April A crew was recognized for putting out a building fire and rescuing multiple pets. A-Crew did an outstanding job on a fire with 4 dogs and 2 cats trapped inside. The crew saved all the pets and some pets had to be resuscitated. We received this note on Facebook Messenger from a neighbor that witness the crew work and took the dogs into her home after they were rescued.

"Today your angels responded to a house fire on Washington St. (my neighbors) and there were several dogs in the house. Your team as I watched waiting to help with the animals however we could, brought them out one by one, most were limp as they were brought out, and my heart sank dearly for I love animals and I know these ones. I watched your crew take off their own masks and give oxygen and take out oxygen and then on the dogs. At one point a younger St Bernard was brought out and laid on the ground, he took his mask off and gave it to the dog and worked with her a bit, and moments later there was her tail wagging against the ground.

You were all amazing at controlling the fire, saving these animals who will all be ok after some tlc , amazing at bringing them next door to my house somewhere safe for them temporarily while this all went on today. You were able to keep the neighborhood safe as well so others did not endure the same hell today. Prayers for you all as well as so much gratitude. Thank you again for treating their animals as family .. for they are .. Hugs and keep safe .."

On April 29th B crew was dispatched to a building fire and grass fire at the same time. The crew split up to respond to both fires and assess the need for mutual aid. The building fire was small enough in nature and on the exterior of the building to be extinguished quickly. The grass fire took some more time and 500 gallons of water was used, but was controlled and extinguished by the responding units from WFD.

Fleet: Engine 2 has not been repaired yet, quotes have been submitted and CVMIC is in the process of determining where we will take the repairs.

Battalion Chief Kraig Kruzan, Fleet manager Solomon King, and myself flew to Ohio April 3rd to perform a mid-build inspection at the Sutphen plant where the new quint fire truck is being built. Some minor adjustments were made, and the build is right on track to be delivered in June.

April 1st we were able to bring our recently purchased and much needed Haz Mat rig home to Wausau from Madison. This rig was purchased from the Madison Fire Department to replace our Haz Mat rig. We will be working on outfitting this truck and trailer throughout April and May to have it ready to respond.

Buildings and grounds: All systems go at all three stations. We started asking for quotes this month to see

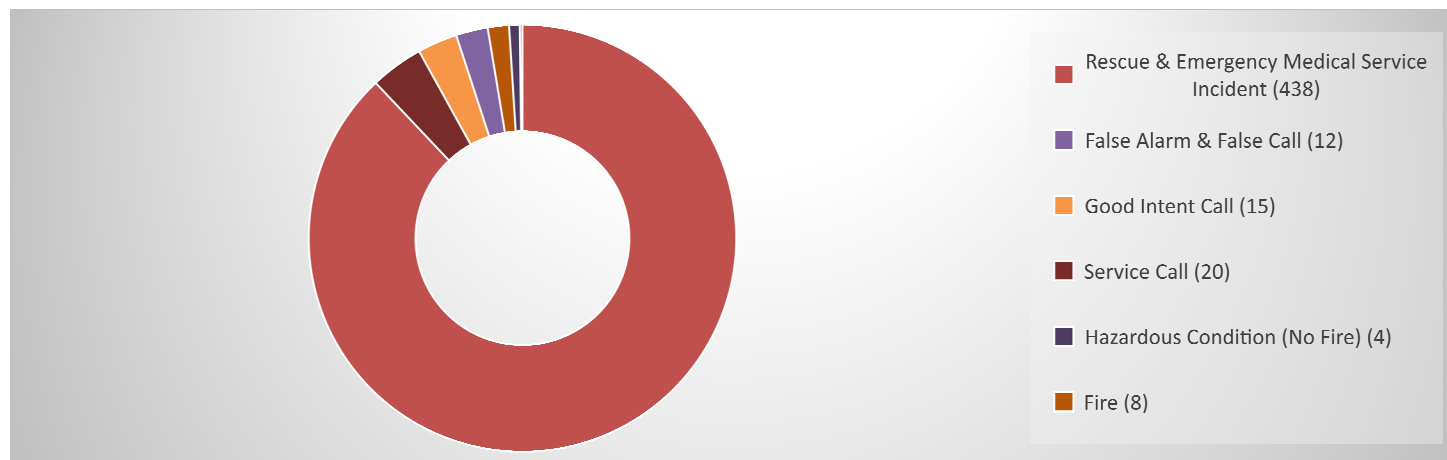
what it would cost to update the apparatus bay at station 3. This is much needed soon with the concrete floor deteriorating as well as the floor drains being in disrepair.

Overtime and scheduling: The line crews continue to work exorbitant mandated overtime shifts. This is necessary because of staffing issues and FMLA usage.

Recruitment and Retention: Interviews and assessments were done on new applicants in April and three new recruits will be starting in May. Recruitment on social media is in full force and I have been talking with individuals on a regular basis who are interested in the field of firefighting, many of these are high school age.

Bob & Randy's Bar, 1515 N. 6th Street

Christine's Bar, 936 S. 3rd Avenue

Officers located the male still in the bar. The bartender added that the male had accidentally knocked over a beer bottle. I advised that Demerit Points would be assessed, but I utilized discretion on issuing a citation to the bartender and owner. I recommend that they be assessed **25 Demerit Points** for being Open After Hours.

Whiskey River Bar & Grill, 5512 Stewart Avenue

- (1) *Event #22048574, 04/15/2022 at 8:37 PM:* CRIMINAL MISCELLANEOUS: A citizen called to report that they thought there was a male at the bar that had an absolute sobriety condition and was in contact with someone he was restricted from having contact with. Officers responded and did not locate the male. The bartender was familiar with the male in question. She said he was no longer allowed in the bar after being involved in the theft of a purse some time ago. She said that male had not been in the bar at all that day.



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Aftershock Bar & Grill, 1418 Leonard Street

No charges for anyone were able to be substantiated, and the stragglers remaining outside the bar had arrangements made for a taxi to take them home.

Labor Temple, 318 S. 3rd Avenue
