Minutes of previous meetings. (3/15/21)

Motion by Herbst, second by Peckham to approve the minutes of the 3/15/21 meeting. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications.

Lisa Rasmussen indicated there were no denial recommendations. She noted there are a number of Special Event applications on the license list. Also, an application for a "Class B" Liquor license from Gonzalo Ramirez for Tres Hermanos at 525 Fulton Street. This establishment currently holds a Class "B" Beer license and would like this added so Margaritas can served at the restaurant. The Liquor License Review Subcommittee met today preceding this meeting and recommended approval unanimously.

Motion by Peckham, second by Wadinski to approve the various licenses listed. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider request for outdoor music in the beer garden on Saturday, May 22, 2021 (M&R Station, 818 S 3rd Ave)

Rasmussen stated Rick & Mary Gordon of M&R Station have outdoor music events every year and to date have not had any issues or complaints. The event on May 22nd would be from 7pm – 10pm.

Motion by Herbst, second by Peckham to approve the outdoor music in the beer garden. Motion carried 5-0.

Discussion and possible action regarding designating the Month of May, 2021, as "No Mow May" and suspending enforcement of W.M.C. §6.48.010 Mowing Required and §6.48.040 Penalty from May 1, 2021 through May 31, 2021.

Lisa Rasmussen indicated this item was forwarded to the committee for consideration from the Sustainability, Energy & Environment Committee. The proposal is to allow people to not mow their lawns during the month of May in the city to assist with the early development of pollinating insects.

Brad Lenz noted the Sustainability Committee approved this recommendation unanimously at their March meeting. He indicated Dr. Israel Del Toro presented on his experiences with other communities at that meeting and is present by WebEx to speak on this subject.

Dr. Israel Del Toro stated he is Assistant Professor of Biology at Lawrence University where his research focus is primarily on data science and pollinator ecology, bringing numbers and ecological stories together. He stated last year when they attempted No Mow May in the City of Appleton they increased the abundance of pollinators fivefold in areas that were not mowed relative to areas that were mowed. They also increased pollinator diversity, or number of species, found in those un-mowed areas threefold. He explained if we leave our lawns to grow out just a little longer during the month of May, then we can actually promote a sustainable greener urban space for our bees and other pollinators to thrive. He stated participating in other ways is also encouraged, such as planting native wild flowers, increasing nesting habitat for bees, or reducing the chemicals applied to lawns.

Dr. Del Toro explained there is a Google form set up where people are asked to register their address and fill out a quick survey. Signage is provided at no cost to citizens that wish to participate in No Mow May. The benefit of the sign is to reduce the number of complaints due to long lawn ordinances and also provides the link for registration to increase community involvement.

Jim Wadinski questioned how citizens mow the lawn after a month of non-mowing. Del Toro stated in Appleton they partnered with Community Gardens for depositing and composting the grass clippings. The grass can also be mulched back into the lawn and/or raked into a composting pile.

Pat Peckham commented honey bees eat pollen and drink nectar and pollen is a great source of protein and energy for them. The bees love the dandelions which are often quickly mowed down. He noted if a person gets half way through the month and no longer wants to do this, nothing is stopping them from ending and mowing.

Rasmussen indicated in the feedback she received in her district two residents are in support, but there has been a volume of push back partially because most of the city is bordered by robust natural and rural areas. During the month of May people in both urban and rural settings are beginning to plant and put out flowering plants. There was concern about wood ticks increasing without mowing, as well as noxious weeds that have gone to seed being carried by the wind into other yards.

Becky McElhaney stated it is an early spring and people are already moving lawns. Feedback she received about not mowing was regarding concern with an increase of ticks and deer ticks. She also felt if they did this people should be required to register for the program.

Dr. Del Toro stated they are strongly, strongly urging participating members to register and the city can have access to that data to know which homes have registered. He reiterated he will make signs available for yards so people know why a lawn isn't being mowed. He commented ticks were also a serious concern for Appleton and for himself, as someone who has had Lyme's Disease. They surveyed in Appleton and found there was no difference in terms of tick abundance between the mowed and un-mowed lawns.

Bill Hebert, Inspections, questioned whether the enforcement suspension would be city wide or if they are only going to allow that suspension for the people that register.

Tara Alfonso, Assistant City Attorney, stated the way the proposed ordinance is written it is a suspension of the current ordinance city wide, so, if a lawn is too long and there is a complaint the city won't enforce for that month.

Motion by Peckham, second by Wadinski to amend and approve the ordinance specifically for suspension of enforcement only for those that have registered to participate in No Mow May and it will sunset on May 31, 2021. Motion carried 4-1. (*Rasmussen was the dissenting vote.*)

Note: Committee consensus was for citizens to place the signs in the yards.

Consider the complaint filed regarding Timothy Nawrocki d/b/a Roc's Place and take possible action on issuance of a summons commanding Timothy Nawrocki d/b/a Roc's Place to appear before the Committee for a hearing pursuant to Wis. Stat. s. 125.12 and W.M.C. s. 5.64.076 to show cause why the Class "B" Beer & Liquor License issued should not be revoked or suspended.

Rasmussen stated their packets contain a complaint sworn out by the Police Department outlining the call history at Roc's since 2019. The owner has been before the committee a couple of times for a Formal Expression of Concern and the establishment now exceeds 100 demerit points again. She stated there is a firmly defined process under the State Statutes Chapter 125 that we must follow. There will not be any public comment, testimony or evidence taken tonight on any of the items listed in the complaint, all of that would be done at a formal hearing. She indicated the committee retains its own counsel, Nathan Miller, and the city has separate counsel, Tara Alfonso.

Police Chief Ben Bliven stated there has been a number of issues at Roc's place with some of them resulting in appearances before this committee. The complaint lays out a summary of the incidents over the last couple of years in regard to fights. He summarized it indicates 15 complaints concerning fights inside the premises or the parking lot, five of which involved weapons or threat of weapons. There also were issues with noise, liquor being outside the establishment and general unruly behavior. Most recently was an incident from February where there was a large fight in the parking lot and a firearm being involved. The PD obtained video from the establishment but there was a gap in the video where the fight actually occurred and they had to go back to get that piece, which indicated a lack of cooperation.

Attorney Nathan Miller explained if the committee wishes to go forward a summons will be served and the hearing must take place no sooner than three days and no longer than 10 days.

Motion by Herbst, second by Wadinski to move forward with a revocation/suspension hearing and direct the issuance of the summons on April 29, 2021. Motion carried 5-0.

Interim Chief Bob Barteck commented at end of the first quarter of 2021 we moved from our Firehouse software to Image Trend software, so the monthly report will be changing next month.

Chief Bliven presented the Wausau PD Operations Report – April 2021. *(Report placed on file.)*

Bliven commented they continue to receive complaints from neighbors. He noted Cpt. Baeten was speaking with one of the residents yesterday who indicated they are continuing to see violations from the patrons with alcohol outside, urinating, and littering. He stated PD will continue extra patrols of the bar due to these complaints. It was noted the establishment currently has 50 demerit points assessed. Rasmussen commented she also continues to receive complaints about After Shock and agreed extra patrols are needed.

Chairperson Lisa Rasmussen noted a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

Consider request for outdoor fundraiser for the Human Society on Saturday, May 22, 2021, 2pm - 6pm (After Shock Bar & Grill, 1418 Lenard St)

Sharon Kingston, owner of After Shock, explained there will be orange temporary fencing in the back of the parking lot next to the outdoor deck/patio, as shown on the diagram, to keep it contained. It was noted the outdoor deck/patio is part of the licensed premise. Kingston stated there will be a grill for brats and burgers and food tent in the fenced area and requested that patrons be able to carry their drinks back and forth into that area to get their food.

Rasmussen indicated she has heard from a number of residents that have concerns about the event and that she also had concerns about enlarging the size of the serving premise. There has been complaints about open intoxicants outside the premise, disorderly conduct by patrons, littering and antagonistic behavior toward the neighbors. Kingston clarified she did not want people congregating in the outside area drinking. She intended for them to be in the bar and banquet area, but wanted to be covered if someone goes outside to that area with a beer in their hand just to get a burger. Rasmussen questioned the issue of noise if there is music. Kingston stated the music will be inside in the banquet hall instead of outside and during a 2pm – 4pm timeframe with the event wrapping up by 6pm. She commented she wants to get along with the neighbors and this event is for a good cause and not intended to be a wild party.

Motion by Peckham, second by McElhaney to approve the event on May 22, 2021 from 2pm-6pm to temporarily expand the premise to an outdoor fenced overflow area no larger than 30' x 40'. Motion carried 4-1. (*Rasmussen was the dissenting vote.*)

Discussion and possible action on the issuance of notice pursuant to Wis. Stat. s. 125.12(3) to Brandenburg's Wagon Wheel Inc. d/b/a/ Wagon Wheel Supper Club/Gary L. Brandenburg, Agent, 3901 N. 6th St. Wausau, WI of the City's intention not to renew its Class B Beer and Liquor License for failure to be open in violation of Wausau Municipal Code s. 5.64.160 Abandonment of premises, and possible selection of hearing date

Rasmussen explained the Municipal Code states holders of Class B Beer & Liquor licenses have to remain open and if they are closed for a period of more than 30 days they are in violation of the abandonment provision. She stated it has been brought to her attention the establishment has not been open for several months, possibly a couple years.

Motion by McElhaney, second by Wadinski to schedule a non-renewal hearing and directed staff to draft the appropriate documentation. Motion carried 5-0. (**NOTE:** *The hearing was subsequently scheduled for Wednesday, June 9, 2021 at 5:15 pm.*)

REVOCATION/SUSPENSION HEARING

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. s. 125.12(2) on Complaint to revoke or suspend the Class B Beer & Liquor License of Timothy A. Nawrocki, Timothy A. Nawrocki d/b/a/ Roc's Place at 810 S. 3rd Avenue, Wausau, WI.

Others Present: Attorney Nathan Miller, representing the Public Health & Safety Committee; Attorney Daniel Cveykus, representing Timothy Nawrocki; Attorney Tara Alfonso, representing the City of Wausau, Timothy Nawrocki, licensee and owner, Roc's Place; Kim Lentz, Court Reporter

Lisa Rasmussen convened the hearing noting a summons and complaint has been filed and read into record a summary of the procedure for the proceedings. She stated if a charge or charges are proven, the committee may recommend to the Common Council that the license be either suspended or revoked and that the Common Council may accept or reject such recommendation and may determine upon such recommendation whether the license should not be suspended or revoked.

OPENING STATEMENTS:

Attorney Tara Alfonso made an opening statement indicating Cpt. Todd Baeten filed the summons and complaint consisting of two counts: 1) pursuant to State Statutes, for operating a riotous and disorderly house; and 2) pursuant to the Wausau Municipal Code, 150 demerit points assessed against the establishment. The city will have to prove one or both of those counts. She stated the evidence will show not only are there numerous instances of fights occurring at the bar, but also weapons threats as well as actual display or discharge of a weapon at the location over a 20 month period. It will also show employees are fearful of retaliation and do not wish to cooperate or speak with officers on scene. She noted other bars nearby to Roc's do not have the same issues as Roc's.

Attorney Daniel Cveykus made an opening statement that the evidence will show the fact that almost 95% of these incidences did not occur at Roc's Place, but that they occurred on a public street or sidewalk. Testimony will show that Roc's Place has been compliant with trying to protect its patrons by establishing protocol, talking with police to conduct walk-throughs, installing even more surveillance cameras, and a desire to make it safer establishment and friendlier to the police.

Police Detective Jim Martin provided testimony on his investigation and video clips were shown and explained.

Police Chief Benjamin Bliven provided testimony of his interactions with the owner and manager of Roc's Place and on the expectations of the Police Department of establishments and demerit points.

Timothy Nawrocki, owner of Roc's Place, provided testimony regarding his operation of the bar, security plans and the incidents at the establishment regarding weapons or threats of weapons.

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to move into closed session. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Wadinski, Herbst, Peckham, McElhaney, and Rasmussen. Motion carried unanimously.

Rasmussen read into record the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law. The Public Health & Safety Committee made the following recommendation that the Class B Beer & Liquor license held by Timothy Nawrocki be revoked.

The license is recommended for revocation based on the following reason: the licensee has violated Wisconsin Statutes 125.12(2)(ag1), 125.12(2)(ag2) as adopted by WMC 5.64.010 and that the licensee keeps or maintains a disorderly or riotous, indecent or improper house.

The revocation recommendation will go forward to the May 25, 2021 Common Council.

SUBJECT: Delegation of Class III Special Event Application Process and Approvals to the Wausau and Marathon County Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department.

Currently the City's Special Events Policy groups events into three classes: Class I, Class II and Class III. Class III events are the smallest events, with less than 100 people expected to attend and are typically events such as weddings and other smaller type gatherings of general interest to the public. Class III events are also normally held on the 400 Block or at one of the City's parks.

The 400 Block and City Parks reservations are handled solely by the Wausau and Marathon County Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department. When a Class III Event is planned, the organizer is required to first reserve the space through PR&F Assistant Director of Community Services, Marcus Aumann, and all coordinating and planning for the Class III Event is done between Mr. Aumann and the organizer. The only role the Clerk's Office is involved in with the Class III Special Events is accepting the short application, collecting the \$40 application fee and following up with Mr. Aumann to ensure the organizer did reserve the space.

For efficiency and customer service purposes, the Clerk's Office is proposing that the Class III Special Events application process and approvals be delegated to the Wausau and Marathon County Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department. This will streamline the process for these small events for all involved and makes sense from an efficiency and customer service perspective.

Section 1. That Section 8.08.170 Licenses is hereby amended to read as follows:

8.08.170 Licenses

(a) Every owner of a dog or cat more than ~~four~~ **five** months of age on January 1 of any year, or ~~four~~ **five** months of age within the license year, shall annually, **or on or before the date the dog or cat becomes five months of age,** pay ~~his~~ **the** dog or cat license tax and obtain a license ~~therefor before~~ **prior to** April 1 of ~~the current~~ **each** year **or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat** ~~on or before the date the dog or cat becomes four months of age~~. The license shall be securely affixed to an animal collar or harness and shall be worn by the dog or cat whenever such animal is out of doors. No such license shall be issued without proof of compliance with the rabies control section of this chapter.

....

(b) A license will be one-half of the amount provided in section 3.40.010(a) if the dog or cat becomes ~~four~~ **five** months of age after July 1 of the license year.

(c) Reserved.

(d) There shall be a late fee as provided in section 3.40.010(a) in addition to the required license fee collected from every owner of a dog or cat, ~~four~~ **five** months of age or over, if the owner failed to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year, or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat, or if the owner failed to obtain a license on or before the date the dog or cat reached licensable age.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the day after its publication.

RE: Animal license tax and late fee

Purpose: To amend Section 8.08.170 Licenses, Wausau Municipal Code (WMC) to comply with state statute and amend Section 3.40.010(a), WMC, regarding amendment to the statutorily permissible late fee. [The matter of the late fee will be considered by Finance Committee; the matter of amending Section 8.08.170 will be considered by Public Health and Safety.]

Currently, license taxes for unneutered male dogs and cats and unspayed female dogs and cats is \$62 for the license year. License taxes for neutered male dogs and cats and spayed female dogs and cats is \$20. This is up \$2 each from the City of Wausau 2020 Comprehensive Fee Schedule. The date of the last increase, prior to 2020, occurred on 11/1/13. The date of the last increase to the late fee occurred in 2014, and it was changed from \$5 to double the license fee. (An \$8 microchip discount was enacted in 2016.)

The license taxes were \$10/\$20 in 2012. The late fee was amended from \$5 to double the applicable license fee on 10/9/12. On January 14, 2014, these animal fees were taken out of the ordinance text and included in the comprehensive fee schedule referenced at 3.40.010(a).

So if an unneutered or unspayed pet was licensed after the owner was required to license it, the owner would face \$186 license tax and late fee. Additionally, following a warning, the owner could face a citation for violation of 8.08.170 WMC, for failing to license a dog or cat, for a \$187 forfeiture. This generated some complaints this year.

It is unknown to this writer what the estimated compliance rate in licensing dogs and cats has been over the past 8-9 years, when the fees significantly increased.

The subject of Pet License Late Fees was on the May 10, 2021 Finance Committee agenda, but deferred to the May 25 meeting due to insufficiency of time.

Legal Analysis: Section 174.05, Wis. Stats., sub. (1) requires that the owner of a dog more than 5 months of age on January 1, or 5 months of age within the license year, shall annually, or on or before the dog becomes 5 months of age, pay the dog license tax and obtain a license.

Sub. (2) sets the *minimum* dog license tax at \$3 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$8 for unsprayed or unneutered dogs, or one-half if the dog becomes 5 months of age after July 1. Sub. (3) enables cities to raise the minimum dog license tax by a majority vote of the council, but requires the council to provide for a greater tax for unsprayed or unneutered dogs.

Sub. (4) sets the license year from January 1 to December 31. (WMC requires payment prior to April 1 each year or on or before the dog or cat becomes 5 months of age.)

Sub. (5) states that “The collecting official shall assess and collect a late fee of \$5 from every owner of a dog 5 months of age or over, if the owner failed to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year, or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog.” *It permits a city to require payment of an “additional fee” (late fee) from any person purchasing a license for a dog 5 months of age or over, or after April 1, when setting the amount of the license tax.*

The license taxes are not to exceed the total cost of all dog licensing, regulating and impounding activities for the previous year, less any statutory refunds, and shall be levied and collected in the same manner as other dog license taxes. I understand the current dog license tax does not cover expenses.

Recommendation: Because the statute does not appear to permit raising the late fee, once provided for, the late fee shall be assessed at \$5. I recommend reducing the late fee back to \$5; looking at the license tax if those revenues do not cover the cost of expenses; refunding for the 2021 calendar year, those late fees paid beyond the \$5 statutory amount.

Section 1. That Section 8.08.010 Certain creatures forbidden, is hereby amended to read as follows:

8.08.010 Certain Creatures forbidden. (a) Wild Animals. It is unlawful for any person to keep, maintain or have in his or her possession or under his or her control within the city any dangerous or wild animal, insect or reptile, or any other animal or reptile of wild, vicious or dangerous propensities. The prohibition of this subsection shall include any of the following animals, reptiles, or insects whether bred in the wild or in captivity, and also any of their hybrids with domestic species listed herein. The animals, reptiles or insects listed in parentheses are intended to act as examples and are not to be construed as an exhaustive list or limit the generality of each group of animals, unless otherwise specified.

...

(d) Exceptions.

...

(2) The prohibitions in subsections (b) and (c) do not apply to farm animals where such farm animals/poultry are part of agricultural fairs, shows or sales of farm animals/poultry sponsored by an agricultural organization which occur at Marathon Park and are no longer than seven days in duration; farm animals/poultry on a display for judging purposes; or a horse, pony, mule or other beast of burden in connection with a horse-drawn carriage licensed under Chapter 5.74 of the Wausau Municipal Code.

(3) The prohibitions in subsections (b) and (c) do not apply to the use of goats by the City of Wausau/Marathon County Parks, Recreation, Forestry Department utilized for vegetation control or abatement purposes within City parks.

(4) The prohibitions in subsections (b) and (c) do not apply to the display of farm animals by the City of Wausau/Marathon County Parks, Recreation, Forestry Department within a City park or on the 400 Block as part of a short term event hosted or sponsored by the department of one day or less.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the day after its publication.

Section 4. This temporary amendment set forth in this ordinance shall automatically repeal on October 31, 2021, at 11:59 pm; no further action shall be required.

Re: Comments relating to temporarily amending Section 8.08.010 certain creatures forbidden (subsection (d) Exceptions).

- Barker Stewart Island is a City park located near down town Wausau. The Island consists of trails, historic mill site foundation, informational signage, benches, railroad corridor and two access bridges.
- Barker Stewart Island is being considered for the relocation of a historic mill building and in discussions regarding this possibility staff and the former Mayor met with the Wausau Police Department, Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin and the Marathon County Historical Society to identify the vision of the island.
- The vision identified for the island is to resemble Isle of the Ferns to the south with trails, open space, large tree cover and very little understory so that the community can see through the island.
- The island's vegetation consists mostly of invasive species such as honeysuckle and buckthorn. Many of the trees on the island are also low quality trees.
- In 2019 the City Council approved \$70,000 for the 2020 Capital Improvement Program to begin the vegetation management of Barker Stewart Island and planning the reconstruction of the Mill Building. The unused funds of 2020 have been carried over to continue to the work in 2021.
- PRF purchased brush clearing attachments for existing equipment and began the vegetation removal in 2020 on the north half of the island. Vegetation removal to the south will continue as time allows.
- The invasive species on the island are very hardy and will continue to come back year after year. There are different methods available for controlling invasive species and many of the methods include chemical treatments. Staff sought alternative methods that would have minimal impact to the island and surrounding water. The utilization of goats grazing is a method that is used more commonly. Staff has contacted some of the communities that currently utilize goats and the method has been very effective. Goats feed on the woody vegetation of the invasive plants.
- Depending on the number of goats and the size of the site the goats will be utilized for a few weeks one to two times per season. They are typically onsite for 4-6 weeks.
- The goats would be restricted to the area in which they are working by an electric fence and the water (goats do not like water). The public would be able to watch the goats but would not be allowed to enter the area in which they are working.
- Staff and/or the farmers will be checking on the goats daily.
- We are asking for the change to Section 8.08.010 because current Municipal Code would not allow for the goats to be utilized for this invasive species control.
- As a way of educating the public about the use of goats and about invasive species the PRF Department would hold a one day special event near the island or on the 400 Block. The event may include a few goats that the public could touch and see up close. The farmers would be present for this event.

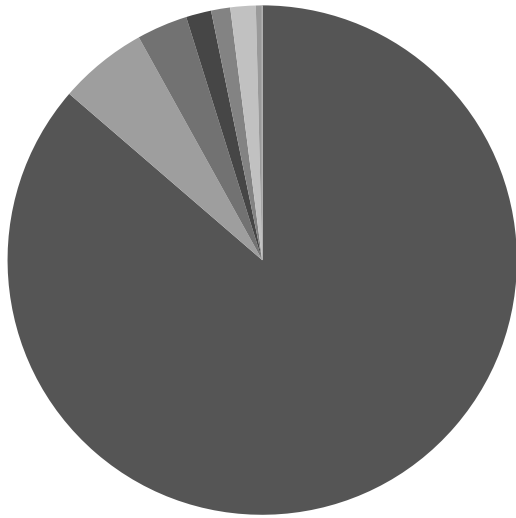

Counting Rules

Counts on this page are based on the month of the incident or arrest, rather than the month the incident was submitted. If the incident date is unknown, the report date is used. Counts are subject to change as data are updated.

Offense counts are calculated based on the number of offenses for each victim (per incident) for Crimes Against Persons and the number of unique offense types (per incident) for Crimes Against Property and Crimes Against Society. For burglary and motor vehicle theft, offense counts are based on the number of premises entered and the number of vehicles stolen, respectively.

Victim counts are calculated based on the number of victims connected to each unique offense type in an incident. For Crimes Against Persons, the number of victims will be equal to the number of offenses. Victims will be counted more than once if they are connected to multiple offenses.

Arrest counts are calculated based on the number of arrestees listed on a Group A or Group B incident. Each arrestee is counted only once per incident. Arrests are categorized based on the specific Group A or Group B arrest code submitted by the agency, rather than the incident offense code. Since agencies only submit the most serious arrest charge for each arrestee on an incident, arrest counts are not indicative of the number of charges.

Incidents are cleared in one of two ways: by arrest or by exceptional means. Clearance counts are based on the number of offenses cleared in a given month regardless of when the offense occurred, and can therefore be greater than the number of offenses in a given month. In incident-based reporting, the first arrest on an incident, or an exceptional clearance, will clear all offenses associated with the incident.

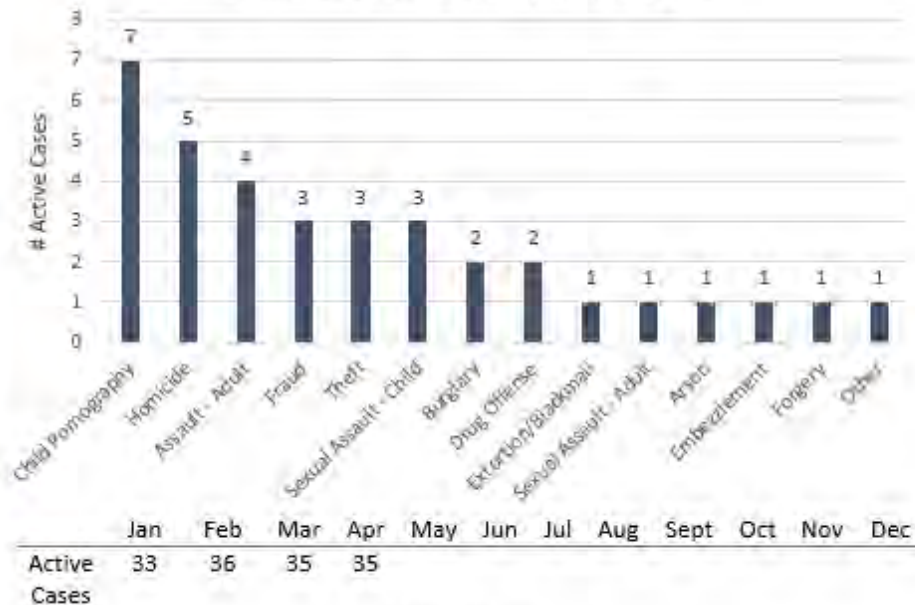

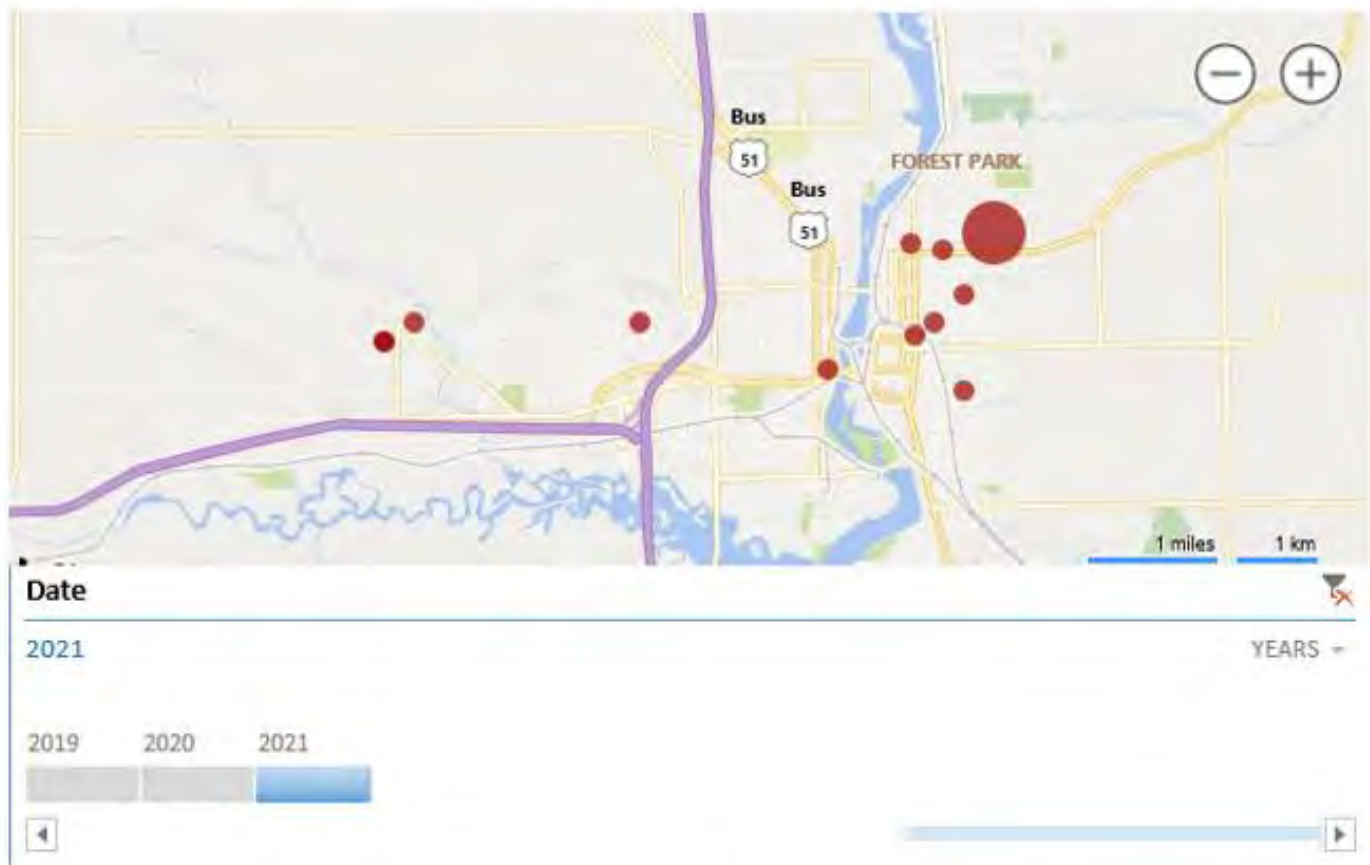

*CART is a shared resource with MNSO; above data represents WPD jurisdiction activities only. WPD has one (1) CART Officer, on M-F day shift schedule. This position is not back-filled during the CART Officer's off-days. MNSO's CART Deputy also responds to relevant CFS in the City when available.

"CFS": Calls For Service (Officer initiated activities and calls received from Dispatch).

"Mental Health" and "Welfare Check" are the two most common types of CFS (coded by Dispatch based on the initial information reported) that involve individuals in crisis.

"Community" origin of 51.15 / 51.45: Law enforcement is called to a location in the community (*residence, business, public location*) in response to an individual in crisis (or incapacitated). De-escalation, safety planning, and/or diversion is not viable or is unsuccessful, resulting in 51.15 or 51.45 detention.

"Facility" origin of 51.15: While under care or custody of the Jail, NCHC, or medical facility; an inmate or patient is suicidal or otherwise assessed on-site by a Crisis Professional, and deemed in need of 51.15. Law Enforcement is then called upon to confirm and complete the 51.15 (as required by WI Stats.) **Lacks opportunity for diversion.**

"51.15": "Emergency Detention" under WI Statute 51.15. Law enforcement may take into custody an individual who is:

- (1) Mentally ill, drug dependent or developmentally disabled, and;
- (2) A substantial probability of physical harm to him/herself or others is evident by recent acts or omissions, attempts or threats.

"51.45": "Alcohol or Drug Detention" under WI Statute 51.45. "A person who appears to be 'incapacitated by alcohol or another drug' shall be placed under protective custody by a law enforcement officer."



Housing Task Force - WPD/NCHC Team update:

As of last week of April: 3 male residents were added to the McClellan Refuge house.

6 total residents:

- 3 are currently employed
- 1 interviewed for jobs this week, received offers and expected to start soon.
- 1 is unable to work (on SSDI).
- 1 is unemployed; looking at SSDI qualification. This individual is one of the recent additions; background as follows, as an example:

A 38 year homeless male w/ history of mental health issues, untreated schizophrenia, some substance abuse, known to engage disorderly conduct and criminal damage downtown in the past. Was serving jail time since December 2020, and was recently released. The HTF team established relationship w/ him while in jail, and agreed to participate shortly after he was released to homelessness again.

April CFS to Big Bull Falls Park area:

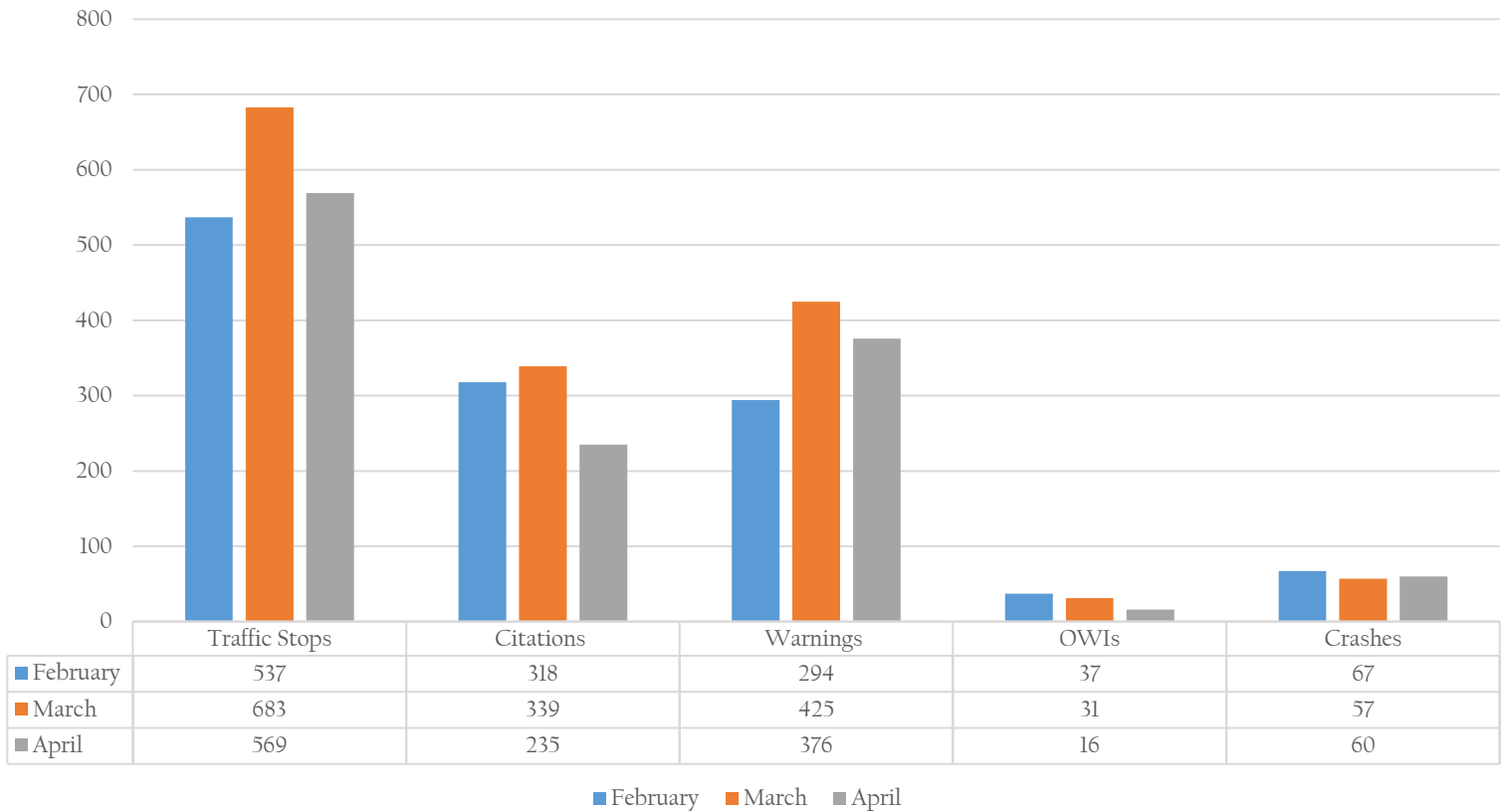
- 3 EMS responses, for reports for intoxicated person (2 calls involved same individual).
- 1 response for a fight (2 individuals; 1 arrested on warrant)
- 1 response a female, lewd conduct (known mental health issues).

North Central Community Action Program -“Street Outreach Specialist” position update: This position was recently filled; the new person is slated to be training for about the next month.

Monthly engagement example: A homeless couple staying at Motel 6, with special needs. HTF team worked with Salvation Army social worker and ADRC on learning and meeting their needs, helping them work up a successful housing application, and eventually secured housing at Diamond View Apartments. The team has established relationships with a growing number of landlords (including Diamond View).



3 Month Traffic Enforcement Comparison

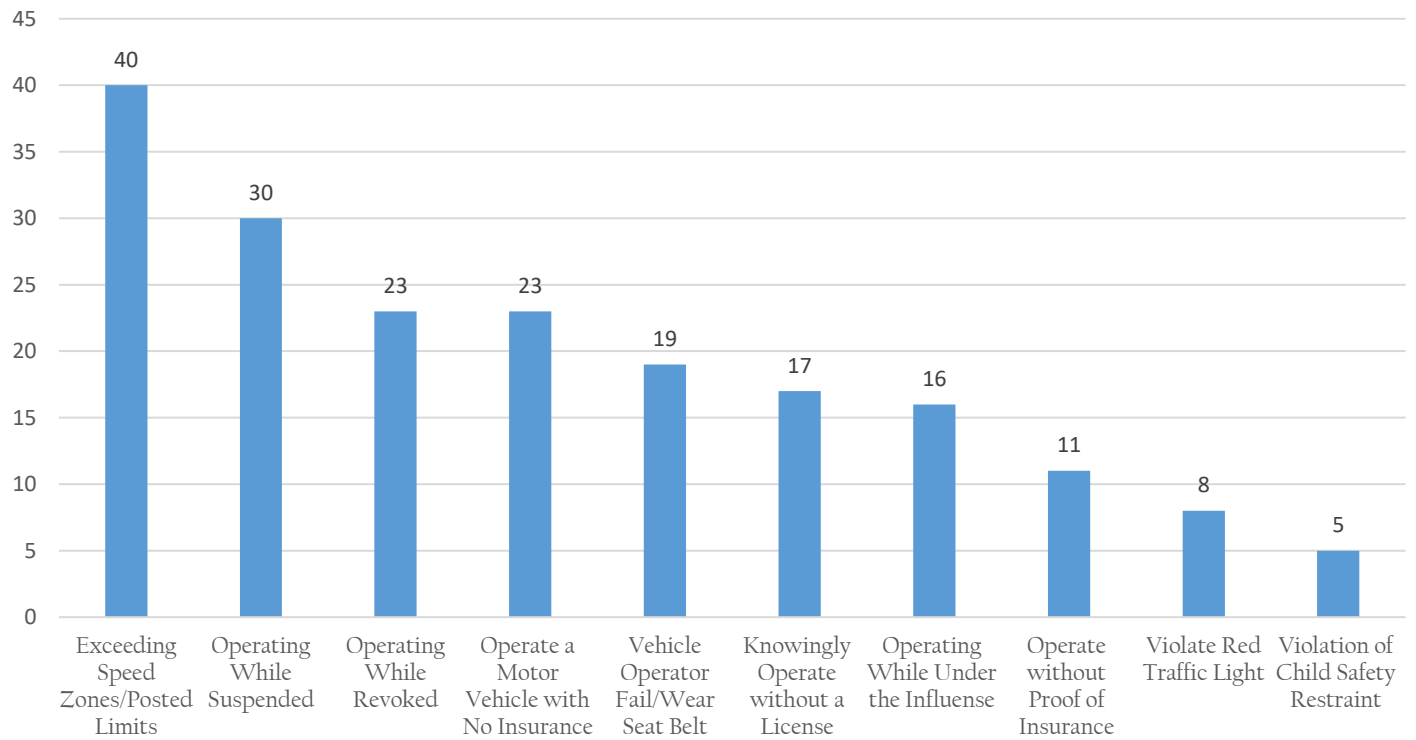

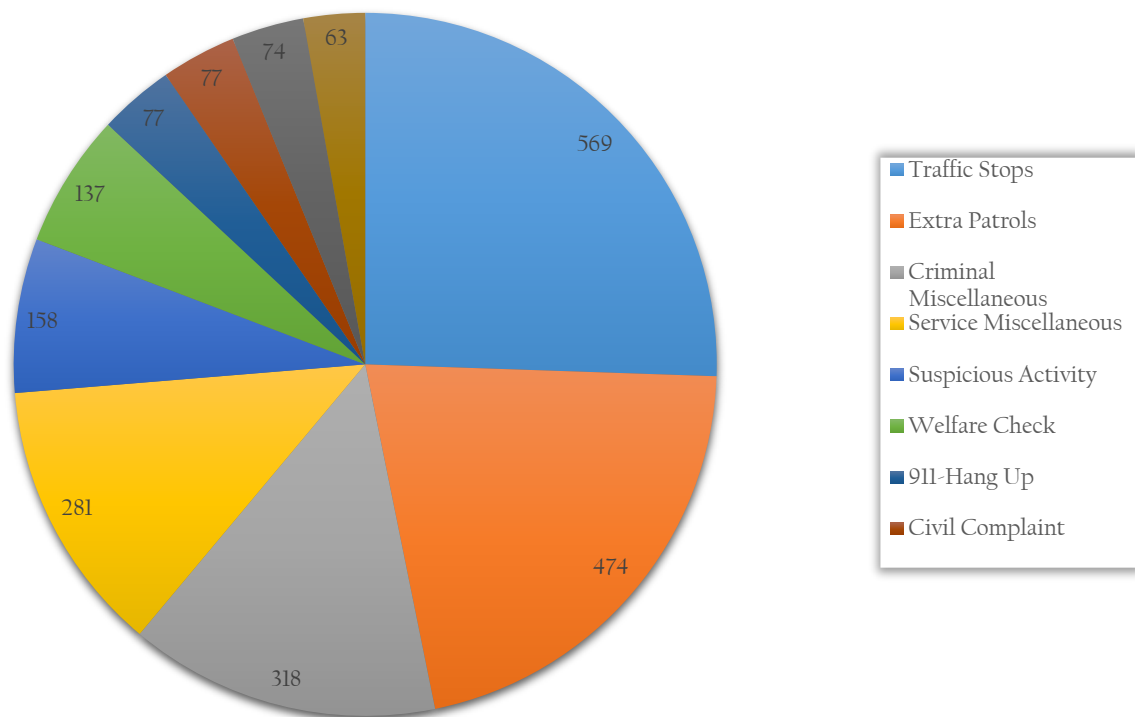

Bob & Randy's Bar, 1515 N. 6th Street

El Jalapenos, 300 N. 3rd Street

An officer responded and checked the area, but did not locate a motorcycle. No further action was taken.
- (3) *Event #21054025, 04/25/2021 at 12:29 AM: VEHICLE ATL:* A citizen that refused to identify themselves reported that a female was intoxicated and would be leaving the bar shortly. The caller named the female, and described the vehicle the female was driving. An officer responded and was in the area within seven minutes, but was not able to locate the vehicle. No further action was taken.



Roc's Place Bar, 810 S. 3rd Avenue

- (1) *Event #21043223, 04/02/2021 at 2:29 PM: SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY:* A citizen that refused to be identified called to report that there were two people on bicycles behind Roc's Place bar. The citizen thought they were trying to break into a trailer. An officer responded and made contact with the two individuals. They stated they were cleaning up a mess they had made. This was confirmed when the officer spoke with the bartender. There were no other issues, and no further action was taken.
- (2) *Event #21044415, 04/05/2021 at 12:53 AM: THREAT WITH WEAPON:* A citizen that refused to be identified called to report hearing a possible gunshot which had been preceded by arguing in the area of the bar. Officers responded and checked the area, but were unable to locate anything. One male was spoken to near the scene. He stated there was no gunshot, but there had been a male and female arguing. Another officer spoke with a bartender who confirmed there was a male and female verbally arguing inside the bar. The two that were arguing were asked to leave along with a friend of the female. People in the bar also denied hearing any gunshot. The officer conducted follow-up by obtaining and viewing surveillance video from Roc's Place. The video showed a "very heated" argument between a male and two females. I one point, the male took a swing at one of the females, got into both of the females' faces multiple times, and was screaming. The bartender got out and told them to leave the property, at which point they all left together. They got into a car that was parked at M & R Station. At no point did the bartender call law enforcement for assistance. The investigating officer did not do a report, as there was no crime substantiated. At this point, as it was simply a verbal argument, and no report was compiled by the officer, I do not recommend any demerit points be issued for failure to notify the police in this matter.

Days Bowl-A-Dome, 1715 Stewart Avenue

- (1) *Event #21043779, 04/03/2021 at 4:26 PM: SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY:* An officer called out that there was a couple yelling at each other in front of the bar. Another officer made contact with the individuals that were yelling, who stated that they were not having an argument. They apologized, stated they were just being loud after having some drinks and were not having altercation. No other enforcement action was taken.
- (2) *Event #21044581, 04/05/2021 at 12:10 PM: ANIMAL COMPLAINT:* A citizen that refused to be identified called to complain about a dog locked in a vehicle in the parking lot of the bar. The caller described the dog as panting and not having any water. An officer responded and found the dog in a vehicle that had all its windows and the sunroof open. The interior of the vehicle was no warmer than the exterior temperature. The officer described the dog as panting, but not in distress. No further action was taken.

101 Pub, 101 N. 3rd Avenue

- (1) *Event #21053029, 04/22/2021 at 7:44 PM: MEDICAL EMERGENCY:* A **bartender** called requesting an ambulance was placed regarding an older female that was unable to walk and had a fast heart rate. Officers also responded, and made contact with the female. The Officers recognized the woman from a similar call at The Domino Bar (see above notations 04/08/2021). The woman was described as being extremely lethargic and having difficulty standing on her own. Bar staff and patrons advised she had been there since approximately 3:00 PM, but had only one drink since 6:00 PM. She was transported by ambulance to the hospital. No further action was taken.

Aftershock Bar, 1418 Lenard Street

- (1) *** Numerous extra patrols have continued through May (a total of twenty). Most entries documented how many vehicles were there, and that there were no disturbances noted. The majority of the entries also noted not seeing anyone outside of the bar. ***
- (2) *Event number 21050815, 04/17/2021 at 11:00 PM: NOISE COMPLAINT:* A caller refusing to be identified reported they were people outside the bar drinking, and there was loud music due to a DJ.



The caller stated an older intoxicated male with a gray long sleeve shirt was on the road, and then went into the bar. On arrival officers noticed one younger male reading the paper in the front steps. Officers could not hear music from outside the bar and decided to make a walk-through. Officers described patrons as not being pleased to see them and noted that staff was “quick to show us the door.” The DJ was not currently playing, but staff did confirm that the DJ had been playing music prior to their arrival. No enforcement action was taken.

Showtime Gentlemen’s Club, 1709 Merrill Ave

- (1) *Event #21043351, 04/02/2021 at 8:00 PM: CRIMINAL MISCELLANEOUS:* An **employee** called to report that there was a male in the parking lot who was not supposed to be on the property according to court papers. Officers responded and discovered the male had left prior to their arrival. The male left his vehicle on the property, which was ticketed for unauthorized parking. The employee wanted the vehicle towed, however the officer advised him he would have to take care of that himself by contacting a tow company.

Records Bureau

Law enforcement would not be able to do its job successfully without access to data. The 76 sworn officers at the Wausau Police Department create a lot of data and paperwork, but it's only useful if it can be found when it's needed, and only if it gets to the correct people. We have 1 Office Manager, 4 Administrative Assistants and 1 Law Enforcement Computer Technician that keep all of our processes moving. They receive information from the officers, be sure it is entered and properly cataloged, forward it to other agencies and departments, and then review and potentially release when requested. This includes paper reports, squad video and body worn camera, photos, and lost and found items.

This department is also the first point of contact for customer service for the public. They are a cheerful, resourceful group who go out of their way to be sure needs get met in as timely a manner as possible.
