Minutes of previous meetings. (6/15/20 & 7/07/20)

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the minutes of the previous meetings on 6/15/20 and 7/07/20.

Motion carried 4-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications.

Rasmussen reviewed the list and noted there were not any denials recommendations.

Motion by Peckham, second by Wadinski to approve the licenses as recommended by staff. Motion carried 4-0.

Request for permanent Amendment of Premise for outdoor beer garden - The Glass Hat, 1203 N 3rd St (Gisela Marks, owner)

Gisela Marks stated they did not re-open the bar when the stay-at-home order was lifted because they did not want to be the mask police and felt there was no clear direction, so she did not want to take any chances. She did not believe they can open the way they did before because they make the most money on weekends when the place is packed. If that is no longer an option, the only option left to enforce social distancing is to expand outside.

Rasmussen questioned if the building immediately next to them was a residence. Gisela explained a neighbor owns both but does not live in that one, it is just storage and she thought it was zoned commercial. Rasmussen questioned the zoning and if it required outdoor spaces to be 50 feet from a residential dwelling. Marks indicated she spoke with Inspections who stated they did not have any requirements. She noted there are fences on the property line and she proposed putting slats into the fence for privacy. She obtained permission for solar lights on the roof to light the area and a spotlight.

Marks indicated she would like to install a four foot fence so people can see into the area and convert a window inside the building into a door for the entry into the beer garden. She stated there will be security cameras outside.

Chief Bliven stated the biggest concern from the police perspective is noise complaints and although the immediate neighbors have been talked to, noise can carry beyond that. He suggested authorizing on a temporary basis instead of permanent to ensure there won't be any issues.

Tara Alfonso suggested doing the recently adopted temporary premise change first with some kind of temporary barrier to keep people in. She questioned if a conditional use permit would be necessary, which typically goes before Plan Commission for approval. Rasmussen agreed and explained since Marks wants a permanent beer garden we need to ensure everything is done correctly. Both Alfonso and Rasmussen felt they needed to consult with Bill Hebert of Inspections/Zoning first.

Marks felt the problem with waiting to try it temporarily was that the projected opening was sometime in September and she had to arrange for the asphalt and fencing and pay deposits down now. She did not want to start construction and invest the money and then have the permission pulled.

Rasmussen stated they would defer action on the item until the next meeting and directed Alfonso to discuss it with Bill Heber prior to the August meeting.

Request for outdoor service of beer and outdoor music for the "Fair State Brewing - Fair Event" on Friday, August 21, 2020, from 5-9PM, at Milwaukee Burger Company parking lot, 2200 Stewart Avenue.

Ashley Sampson, Milwaukee Burger Company, explained they would like to serve alcohol outside and host a fair style event in their parking lot. She indicated she worked with Fair State Brewing Company to distribute their specific products outside. Since the fair was canceled this would be a way citizens participate in a smaller event with their children to enjoy fair foods like cheese curds, funnel cakes, etc., and games. She stated she met with the Health Inspector regarding portable fryers for the food and also with the Fire Inspector for requirements, as well as

property management for obtaining orange fencing. They will ID and wrist band people and will have licensed people serving. There will be designated staff members working to ensure Covid protocol is followed.

Motion by Herbst, second by Wadinski to approve the outdoor event at Milwaukee Burger Company on August 21, 2020. Motion carried 4-0.

Discussion and possible action regarding Ordinance Repealing Section 9.04.032 Unnecessary blowing of railroad whistles and horns-Penalty and Section 12.44.030 Obstructions by railroads; and, amending Section 1.01.025(c)(1)(B) Schedule of cash deposits

Rasmussen stated they had originally envisioned making two changes, one that would allow the railroad to be potentially cited for blocking intersections for too long; the second is the train whistle issue, however, it may need to be left as is because it is a grandfathered provision. She explained there are “quiet zones” in the city where in exchange for an agreement with the railroad not to sound the train whistle at intersections in certain areas, the city had to invest in crossing arms to block the road. She noted there are crossing arms at intersections on S 1st Avenue and S 3rd Avenue.

Tara Alfonso indicated she reviewed city ordinances and found an existing train horn prohibition. She learned if there was an existing ordinance that pre-dated the final train whistle rule, it can be kept if force, so that will not be repealed. She noted the penalty for obstructing the intersection will need to be amended as well. Alfonso stated it has come out fairly clear from the appellate court decision in 2018 that the obstruction of the intersection by the railroad cannot be regulated. The court stated given the extensive regulations and the wording of the Federal Railroad Safety Act, municipalities cannot keep trains from blocking intersections.

Alfonso summarized she would remove the language that repealed Section 9.04.032 Unnecessary blowing of railroad whistles and horns from the ordinance presented in the packet and bring the corrected ordinance to Council. She noted this action is basically cleaning up our municipal code.

Motion by Wadinski, second by Peckham to approve an ordinance repealing Section 12.44.030 Obstruction of railroads and amends the schedule of cash deposits. Motion carried 4-0.

Operations Report from Fire Department for June 2020

Deputy Chief Barteck stated the biggest event last month was a transformer fire at Marathon Electric. Station #2's alerting system is being worked on to work out bugs. *Report placed on file.*

Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities

Chief Bliven presented the Tavern Report from June 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020. *See attached*
No discussion, the report was placed on file.

Communications

Deb Ryan spoke regarding calls received from residents on S 14th Avenue regarding noise from the construction at the former Mountain Lanes site. The complaint is that they have been working every day from 6AM to 6PM. Residents would like a break in the noise on the weekends and holidays. There is also an issue with parking too many cars parked on the streets by the workers.

NOTABLE INCIDENTS AT TAVERNS TO WHICH POLICE WERE DISPATCHED.

6th Street Pub, 2002 N. 6th Street

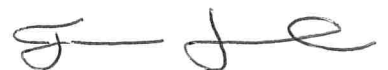

This event had placed me in a financial hardship; without a taxi license, shortage in employment opportunities for a 64 year old woman nearing retirement. Not only has the loss of my taxi license, but also the pandemic has placed me further into a financial hardship resulting in having to rely on family to make ends meet for my essential needs.

I respectfully request that you and the counsel consider a obligatory payment plan to pay off the debt to the city due to a delinquency of my water bill balance. Re: Comments on Proposed Amendments to City of Wausau
Events Policy and Procedures

- The Bridge Clinic has contacted the City of Wausau to see whether it would be possible for it to use a parcel of unimproved, vacant City owned property which is located across the street from one of its sponsored community gardens. The Bridge Clinic would like to use the property to host a short term, five (5) part yoga in the garden series. Participants would be limited to approximately 15 people, and each session would be one (1) hour long. A small donation would be requested by the Bridge Clinic from participants.
- While the City of Wausau Events Policy and Procedures ("Events Policy") governs events held in municipal parks or public rights of way (such as streets), the City has no policy governing the use of other City owned property not typically held out for public use, such as vacant residential lots or parcels awaiting future development or sale.
- The accompanying proposed draft of the Events Policy would amend the current version to provide guidelines and regulations for the short term, limited use of such vacant, unimproved parcels by the community. City staff will investigate the options for future Council consideration regarding any long term use of such property.
- If the City, through its Council, determined it desired to allow use of these parcels, guidance and limitations on the use are potentially numerous. For purposes of discussion, the current proposal includes the following:
 - Limits the event to a maximum period of two days in a row.
 - Limits a recurring event to 5 events, up to four hours each event.
 - Those desiring an extended use would need to submit another application.
 - The City would provide no services or equipment.
 - No beer or wine concessions would be permitted.
 - The fee for a permit would be \$15.00/day or each period of repeating use (a similar fee to obtaining a youth vending permit). For comparison purposes, a Class I Event fee is \$200.00, a Class II Event fee is \$60.00 and a Class III Event fee is \$40.00. Rental of Oak Island Shelter noncommercial/ day is \$153.00; Sylvan Hill Chalet noncommercial/day is \$228.00.
 - Use may only be for a small amount of participants and may be "invitation only."

- Permits may be issued by the City Clerk without the need for approval of PH&S and Council to facilitate a quicker application process.
- The application would require the sponsor of the event to sign an indemnification and release in favor of the City. Similar to a Class III Event, no insurance, however, would be required.
- There is no restriction on who/organizations that may apply.

City of Wausau Events Policy and Procedures

GOAL

It is the goal of the City of Wausau to encourage and coordinate special community events, while regulating these events in a positive manner to ensure the health and safety of participants in the event, efficient management of City services and the protection of public lands and facilities.

DEFINITION OF EVENT

"Event" means any planned extraordinary occurrence requiring City services and/or on public right-of-way or public premises including but not limited to: parades, processions, festivals, athletic events and events requiring street closures. "Event" also includes limited uses of unimproved City owned real property as defined below. "Event" does not include static, unattended displays or exhibits for any duration of time.

EVENT CLASSIFICATION

There are three classes of events: Class I, Class II and Class III. Each class has its own characteristics. An event does not have to have all the characteristics listed to be in the classification. The City reserves the right to make final determination of an event's classification. "Ongoing event" is a single event of any duration that occurs over multiple consecutive days. "Repeating event" is an event that occurs multiple times according to the same pattern.

LIMITED USE-OTHER CITY PROPERTY

The City owns certain unimproved real property not typically held out for public use, such as vacant residential lots or parcels awaiting future development or sale ("vacant parcel"). These unimproved vacant parcels may lend themselves to temporary, short-term and limited use (collectively "limited use events") not inconsistent with the use of neighboring properties owned by private individuals or organizations, such as exercise or workout activities, outdoor educational sessions, and the like. Notwithstanding the provisions applicable to Class I, II and III Events, these limited uses do not require City services, City equipment, or street closures, and will only involve a small number of people. For purposes of the City of Wausau Events Policy and Procedures, these limited uses are referred to as "Class-Limited Use."

CLASS I: (\$200.00) (*Ongoing event up to 7 days \$250.00 or Repeating event up to 15 occurrences \$400.00)

- Event will have a large number of participants and/or spectators (500 or more people).
- Event is open & may attract interest from the general population of the community & surrounding area.
- Usually involves the closing of a street (except residential block parties).
- May involve multiple events (i.e. parade and football game, carnival and crafts).

CLASS II: (\$60.00) (*Ongoing event up to 7 days \$75.00 or Repeating event up to 15 occurrences \$120.00)

- Event is open to the public, but is only of interest to a certain segment of the community (i.e. runners, walkers, supporters of certain causes, bicyclists, etc.).
- Most athletic events (i.e. tournaments, fishing contests).
(The events policy does not apply to local youth sports organizations that contract for regular season games or tournament play)
- May involve the closing of a street (except residential block parties).

CLASS III: (\$40.00)

- Event may be of general interest and open to the public, but will only involve a small number of people.
- May involve the closing of a street (except residential block parties).

CLASS-LIMITED USE: (\$15.00/day or each period of Repeating use) (Ongoing use up to 2 days or Repeating use up to 5 occurrences/4 hour maximum each occurrence)

- Use will only involve a small number of people and may be "invitation only."
- Use will not require City services or equipment, or street closure.

EVENT REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS

Application Deadline and Fee:

Class I	2 months prior to the event	\$200.00	Late Fee	\$200.00
Class II	2 months prior to the event	\$ 60.00	Late Fee	\$100.00
Class III	1 month prior to the event	\$ 40.00	Late Fee	N/A
Class-Limited Use	2 weeks prior to the use	\$ 15.00	Late Fee	N/A

*NOTE: Multiple Day events or Serial Day events will incur an additional charge (see above)

Event Permits:

Event permits are required in advance for all classes of special events and limited use events. Permits do not include vending permits that may also be required.

Vending Permits:

If sales occur at the event, all event vendors must obtain permission to vend from the event organizer and obtain a valid permit, if needed, from the Marathon County Health Department

City Facilities, Park Land and Open Spaces:

The City establishes rental rates for city facilities, park land and open spaces annually. Event organizers intending to use a rentable park facility or whose event precludes normal occupancy and use of a rentable park facility must reserve it separately. **Submitting an event application does not reserve a rentable park facility and reserving a park facility does not give approval for the event.** Contact the Parks Department at 715-261-1550 to reserve a park shelter or facility.

THE 400 BLOCK

Contact the Park's Department (715-261-1550) to reserve The 400 Block prior to submitting this events application. **Reserving The 400 Block does not give approval for the event and submitting an events application does not reserve The 400 Block.**

DEFINITION

Public space for the use and enjoyment of the public.

BLOCK USAGE

The Block may be reserved for free events of interest to the general public, keeping with accepted standards of behavior and content. Up to 25% of the space may be rented by private groups for private events.

Events on the block will be limited to the hours of 7:00 am, to 12:00 midnight. Security may be required if a request is made for events or event-supported structures to be in the park outside of park hours. Overnight camping and grilling are prohibited on the block. Vehicles may not be driven or parked on the block. Beware of buried water lines on the block. They are shallow and could easily be damaged by tent stakes or other objects pounded into the ground.

BLOCK COORDINATION AND SCHEDULING

Reservations will be made through the Parks Department. It is recommended to reserve the block early as it is a first-come-first-serve basis. Reservations will not be taken for events occurring more than 12 months away.

NOTE: Reservation of the 400 Block does not automatically permit the event. Approval process requires a special events application be completed and filed with Clerk/Customer Service at City Hall. All conditions and requirements of the Special Event Policy, Municipal, State and Federal rules, regulations and guidelines must be followed prior to obtaining a permit.

BLOCK RENTAL FEES

Fees for services are listed on the next page of this policy. Rental rates for The 400 Block are as follows:

Private event sponsored by a private group	\$200/less than four hours per day \$400/greater than four hours per day
Admission event	\$200/less than four hours per day \$400/greater than four hours per day
Free event – open to the public	\$75/less than four hours per day \$150/greater than four hours per day

Event organizers should make every effort to secure resources and manpower from the private sector. For those instances where the City or County must provide service, the event shall be required to pay the anticipated cost to the City Clerk at least 3 business days prior to the event permit being issued. Events other than those directly sponsored by the City of Wausau shall fully reimburse the City for services rendered.

There are times when the city must provide unanticipated service following the event's conclusion. Fees for those instances, services will be billed to the event following the event's conclusion.

Fees or charges imposed under this policy shall not include any fee or charge for City services in connection with an

event when the service is directly related to protection provided or precautions taken in anticipation of reaction or response to expressive activity which is protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution.

**Set up, delivery and pick up of equipment are not included in the daily rental rates and will be charged per hourly rate based on actual time spent. Delivery and pickup of equipment is to be scheduled at least two weeks in advance and may not always be available for all items.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

Damages or Cleanup:

If required, damage to city property or clean up after an event shall be invoiced to the event organizer following the event's conclusion.

The City of Wausau is an Eco-friendly municipality and as such requires event organizers to recycle as part of their cleanup plan. You will be required to contract with a company to provide garbage collection and recycling services for the event.

Insurance:

A commercial general liability policy is required in the following minimum amounts for Class I and Class II events.

Per person / injury	\$ 500,000
Per occurrence / injury	\$ 500,000
Property damage	\$ 500,000
Public liability and property damage and excess liability umbrella policy	\$1,000,000

Applicant must sign a hold harmless agreement and provide the City with a certificate of insurance showing insurance written by a company licensed by the State of Wisconsin and covering any and all liability or obligations which may result from the applicant's employees, agents, contractors, or subcontractors. **The certificate shall name the City of Wausau as an additional insured.** Proof of insurance, including coverage and exceptions must be provided to the City prior to the event permit being issued.

Ordinances:

Sponsors, participants and organizers of special and limited use events must comply with all applicable state, federal and municipal regulations and ordinances.

Total Occupancy of City Lands and Facilities:

An event may be allowed to totally or partially occupy the following Parks: Oak Island, Athletic, Riverside, Boileau Field, Woodson, Yawkey, City Hall, White Water, Big Bull Falls, Stewart, Sylvan Hill, portions of the River Edge Parkway, Fern Island, Picnic Island and Brockmeyer Park and The 400 Block.

Other City lands and facilities: Wausau Downtown Airport, County Parks located in the City limits and school properties located in the City limits, and Specified Parade Routes and limited use vacant parcels.

Public Safety:

Event organizers are responsible for ensuring the safety of the participants in their event. Depending upon the size, location, and nature of the event, the City may require any or all of the following: Private security on site, police on site, metal detectors, first aid services, EMS on site, internal communication system, external communication system, public address system, night lighting, exit signage, emergency plan including evacuation plan, weather monitoring, fire extinguishers and/or fire protection systems.

Parking:

Adequate parking must be available to support the event without causing undue disruption of normal commercial or residential activities. Off-site parking combined with shuttle transportation may augment on-site parking

Commercial Sales:

Sales of food, beverages and merchandise are allowed during special events on public property and at limited use events under the following conditions:

- a. Food, beverage and merchandise sales must be secondary to the primary theme or activity of the event.
- b. Vendors must have express written permission from the event organizer and proper permits from the Marathon County Health Department. Event organizers are responsible for obtaining registration information for all vendors participating in their event.
- c. Merchandise sold by vendors during an event shall be reviewed by and have approval of the event organizer.
- d. Event vendors are responsible for obtaining and displaying all appropriate sales permits, health/sanitation licenses, food and beverage and vending permits if required. All food & beverage vendors should complete the food & beverage worksheet.

Wine and/or Beer Sales:

Wine and Beer concessions are allowed under the conditions of City ordinance 5.64.150 as follows: A Temporary Class "B" / Class "B" Retailers License (picnic license) must be obtained. These are only eligible to churches, foundations or bona fide clubs in existence for at least six months. Licensed operators (bartenders) are required. A Retailer's license application is required by state law to be on file with the City Clerk a minimum of 15 days prior to issuance and requires approval from the City Council. If you are planning to serve beer or wine at your event file a "Temporary Class B Retailers" application at least 30 to 45 days in advance of this event. No Wine or Beer concessions are permitted at limited use events.

Enclosure Required—Picnic License.

- a. The license holder of a special Temporary Class "B" Retailers License (picnic license) shall cause to be installed around the main point of sale a fence or fences at least seven feet in height measured from ground level, or two fences at least four feet high and eight feet apart, in order to control ingress and egress of persons and consumption of fermented malt beverages; and shall station an adult at the entrance to the area for the purpose of checking age identification. The herein described fence regulations shall not apply to a licensed area within an enclosed building.
- b. No fermented malt beverage shall be served to or consumed by anyone outside of the fenced-in area unless a waiver has been requested and granted pursuant to conditions described in WMC 5.64.150.
- c. All license holders issued a Temporary Class "B" Retailers License (picnic license) shall post in a conspicuous location at the main point of sale and at all entrances to the facility a sufficient number of signs disclosing that

no fermented malt beverage shall be served to any underage person.

- d. A licensed operator (bartender) shall be stationed at all points of sale at all times. (Ord. 61-4591 §1, 1986.)

Bands, Public Address Systems and Entertainment:

If the event includes the use of public address systems, amplified music or live entertainment, this information must be detailed on the application when submitted. Event organizers should contact neighboring residential properties within 200 feet of the event of noise issues as to the type of noise, the dates of the event, the expected times of when the noise will begin and conclude at least 15 days prior to the event. If complaints are received, the Wausau Police Department shall require the event organizer to reduce the sound volume. If the organizer(s) fail to reduce the sound volume to an acceptable level, they shall be subject to a penalty as provided by City noise ordinance.

Event organizers are responsible for contacting the Department of Inspections and Electrical Systems for any electrical assistance they may need for band equipment, amplifiers, stage lighting, temporary lighting, food and beverage vendors, etc. Questions regarding electrical use should be directed to Dept. of Inspections 715-261-6780.

Accessibility:

Event organizers are responsible for ensuring their public event complies with the accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Many events change the normal use patterns or exceed the normal design capacity of public facilities. Organizers are responsible for providing any additional facilities such as accessible parking, travel-ways, seating, restrooms, drinking water, etc., plus service and program access for individuals with physical, sight, speech, hearing and other impairments covered by the ADA.

Sanitation and Toilet Requirements:

Depending on the nature of the special event, organizers may be required to provide additional restroom and refuse facilities such as portable toilets, hand-washing stations, garbage cans, dumpsters, etc.

Street Closures:

If your event requires closure of a street, please detail such request on the application. The Police Department and Public Works will review your application and determine whether to permit the closure. Please note that arterial streets, major collector streets, and bus routes may not be acceptable for closure. By submitting the application, the applicant shall be responsible for contacting all persons on the block; for verifying there are no objections to the street closing; for placing barricades and signs, on the street as directed by City officials, removing them after the event; and for cleanup of all debris by 9:00 am., the morning after the event.

Fire and EMS response apparatus require a minimum of 20 foot width clearance for vehicle access. All access lanes/roads must be kept clear to that width for emergency vehicles. Cul-de-sacs should have a minimum turning diameter of 70 feet, and other type turnarounds such as L-types, T-types, and Y-types should allow for fire apparatus with a wheelbase of 25 feet to turn around with no more than one (1) backing maneuver. Access into and around individual display booths, tents, facilities, restrooms, etc. must be maintained to the extent that personnel with ambulance cots, EMS equipment, and/or fire equipment can maneuver freely and quickly when responding to an emergency. Street barricades should be easily removable to admit emergency/police vehicles as necessary with minimal time delay.²

Parades:

Parade organizers must apply for a special event permit from the City Clerk. The application must include details as to the exact parade route, the location of staging and demobilization areas, the times of the parade start and finish, the size of the parade including number of floats and an itinerary or schedule of times for each detail i.e. staging at location and time, parade on route at time, demobilization at location and time, etc. The City Clerk will determine the appropriate class category.

Parade organizers must submit a map of the parade route with their event application. All parades must be held on parade routes approved by the Traffic Lieutenant and Director of Public Works. Streets are normally closed for parades. The City will determine the number, type and location of barricades and/or traffic cones required.

The City shall place the barricades or traffic cones at the appropriate time and shall remove them from the street when they are no longer needed. Non-City sponsored events will be billed for the cost of services provided.

Cancellation: Cancellation of any event, for any reason, shall result in charges for actual services provided, forfeiture of permit fees and any other forfeiture related to facility or equipment rentals.

Endorsement: Permits to use City of Wausau Parks including the 400 Block do not constitute City of Wausau or Wausau/Marathon County Parks Recreation and Forestry department (WMCPRF) endorsements of policies, beliefs, or goals of the sponsor, nor shall any advertisement or publicity indicate endorsement or sponsorship by the City or WMCPRF without prior approval of a standing committee or the City's Common Council. Staff reserves the right to approve or deny each application for the use of its facilities under the standards of this policy. City or WMCPRF activities and those that the city and/or WMCPRF jointly sponsor will have first priority in scheduling and may obtain full use of the park.

Approval Process:

Event applications are reviewed by staff consisting of representatives from (any or all of) the following entities: Parks Department, Police Department, Fire Department, Inspections/Electrical Department, Engineering Office, Department of Public Works, City Clerk, Mayor, and Marathon County Health Department. These departments will review the application for compliance of areas under their expertise. Should a department have a concern, they will contact you directly to provide assistance. Once the event is reviewed, staff will make recommendations to the Public Health & Safety Committee who approves the event prior to issuance from the City Clerk. Please note the Public Health & Safety Committee only meets once per month. It is in your best interest to get your application filed well in advance of your event.

Upon submission of a completed application and payment of the event fee, permits for limited use events may be approved and issued by the City Clerk and do not require Public Health & Safety Committee or Council review or approval.

A listing of events shall be provided to Council on a monthly basis; however approval of the event is delegated by Council to the Public Health & Safety Committee. Events denied, shall receive a refund of application fees less 25% administrative processing fee.

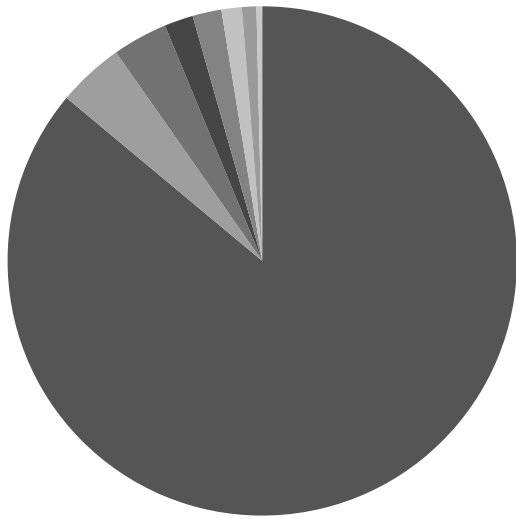

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Hiawatha Bar, 713 Grant Street

- (1) *Event #20086534, 07/16/2020 10:39 PM:* **Employees** called for officers in reference to a woman that had walked into the patio area and began grabbing people's glassware and throwing it in the fire pit and on the ground. On officers' arrival, the woman had left the area, but was located short distance away. In questioning the female she provided inconsistent responses.
