Lisa Rasmussen stated all of the appropriate city departments have reviewed the application and indicated approval. The Park Department's approval was conditional on the receipt of the Certificate of Insurance and a parking plan.

Tony Gonzalez, AHA organizer, addressed the committee stating the event is new so he wasn't sure what the turnout would be. He noted the event will also include a vaccine clinic. The proposed amendment to Section 17.10.030 is requested in an effort to include a penalty for non-reporting of a system inspection or repair. All contractors who perform work on systems (defined in the ordinance) within the city are required by this ordinance to submit the report via an online portal to our third-party record keeping system, The Compliance Engine.

This matter was brought about due to non-compliance by APEX Fire Protection LLC. APEX was contacted several times by Lt. Kariger and TCE in an effort to verify completion of a deficient sprinkler system repair. APEX is familiar with TCE procedure and had uploaded reports in the past, however, had abruptly stopped at some point in 2019. It took several months of repeated communication by WFD, TCE and the city attorney's office to obtain compliance and get the report uploaded.

This amendment would create a fee structure more in-line with the city's inspection department for non-compliance of the permit process. APEX continues to perform inspections and service of fire protection systems within the city with no regard to the ordinance in place.

(d) *Penalty.* The penalty for any violation of this section shall be a forfeiture in the deposit amount of \$100.00 plus the cost of prosecution. Penalties are double for second and subsequent offenses.

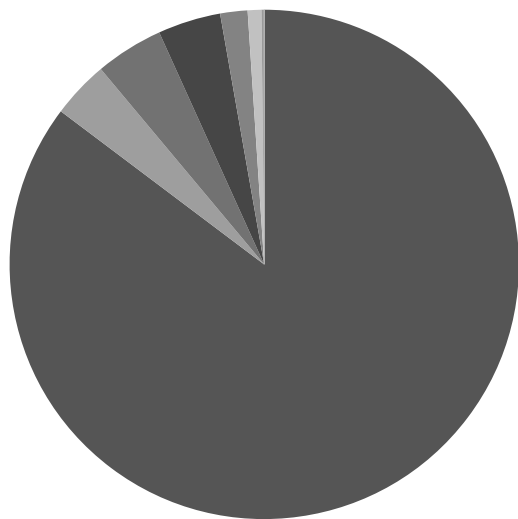

NOTABLE INCIDENTS AT TAVERNS TO WHICH POLICE WERE DISPATCHED.

6th Street Pub, 2002 N. 6th Street

- (1) Extra patrols have been done to determine if the bar has been open. The bar was checked twenty-three (23) days, and never found to be open for business during the month of August, 2021.

Bob & Randy's Bar, 1515 N. 6th Street

- (1) *Case #21007240, 08/13/2021 at 1:16 AM:* SERVICE MISCELLANEOUS: An officer was given an anonymous request to conduct a drive through or walk through of the property. Upon doing so, the officer made contact with multiple individuals outside of the bar, most of whom were intoxicated. Two females started yelling back and forth and were ultimately arrested, and given disorderly conduct municipal citations for their behavior.

Cop Shoppe Pub, 701 Washington Street

- (1) *Case #21006947, 08/03/2021 at 04:47 AM:* ALARM: A commercial burglar alarm was received from the business. Officers responded and found the business to be secure. No key holder responded, and an alarm form was completed and submitted.
- (2) *Event #21111540, 08/13/2021 at 2:01 AM:* EXTRA PATROL: An officer conducted extra patrol after observing a large group of people outside the bar in the back, making a lot of noise. There was also a motorcycle revving loudly in the parking lot. The officer remained in the area until the crowd cleared out, which was relatively quickly.

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- (3) *Case #21007419, 08/19/2021 at 9:50 PM: FIGHT:* Officers were dispatched to report of someone having been punched in the face by a drunk female. The suspect was reportedly still on scene, and had children with her. On arrival, officers were not able to locate the suspect at the scene. The incident started inside the bar, where the victim observed a “baby” walking across the floor. When the victim inquired who the parent was, the suspect picked up the child by the arm and told the victim not to worry about it. The suspect left the bar with the child. A short time later, the victim went outside to smoke a cigarette and observed the same woman standing in the south end of the parking lot. The victim approached the woman to ask her about the kids, at which point the suspect punched the victim in the face, causing a bloody nose. The victim did complain of pain, advised that the injury was caused without consent, and wished to pursue charges. The victim described herself as a regular customer, and said she had not seen the suspect in the bar prior to this incident. Officers requested surveillance video from management, and received video from the parking lot in a relatively timely manner. However, the incident took place off-screen from the view of the cameras. Officers were not provided footage from the interior of the bar, where identification of the suspect prior to the incident may have been possible. The management of this establishment has a reputation for either failing to provide video footage, failing to respond to officers’ requests for footage, or providing video footage that is nonessential. Officers made contact with a potential suspect, who denied involvement. Further investigation is expected, to include a potential photo lineup. No arrest has been made at this time.

Hiawatha Restaurant and Lounge, 713 Grant Street

- (1) *Event #21108600, 08/07/2021 at 9:21 AM: ALARM:* Officers responded to a report of a commercial burglar alarm, described as an entry/exit alarm. An employee was reported to have been on scene, however did not have the proper passcode. A key holder initially did not answer the phone call to respond. On arrival, officers located an unsecured door, and received no response when calling out for employees. Upon entry, they located an employee that was cleaning who claimed he had never been given a passcode. While the officers were still on scene the key holder arrived.
- (2) *Case #21007247, 08/13/21 at 8:38 AM: ALARM:* Officers responded to a report of a commercial burglar alarm, similar to what is described above. The alarm company spoke to a male named “Tim,” who advised everything was okay but gave the wrong passcode. On arrival, officers found the building to be secured. It appeared the male that the alarm company spoke to over the phone had left. The key holder did not respond. He was sent a text by a handyman who occasionally did some work at the bar. A false alarm form was completed.

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Intermission Bar, 325 N. 4th Street

- (1) *Event #21107299, 08/04/2021 at 10:38 PM: MEDICAL EMERGENCY:* An ambulance was requested for a patron that fell off a bar stool and was bleeding from the head. An officer responded as well and spoke with the bartender on duty. The bartender claimed the male had not come into the bar intoxicated, and had served him five 12-ounce cups of beer, and no shots. The male claimed he had been served by someone prior to the on-duty bartender, and had a total of two shots of whiskey and at least ten beers. Other patrons at the bar described the incident as the male simply having fallen off the bar stool, and hitting his face on the floor. The officer noted that he would be reviewing video, however no disposition was entered.
