Minutes of previous meetings. (7/20/20)

Motion by Herbst, second by Peckham to approve the minutes of the previous meeting on 7/20/20. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications.

Rasmussen stated there were not any denial recommendations for this meeting.

Rasmussen stated a Monster Truck event is scheduled to take place at Marathon Park at the end of the month and expected to draw 3,000 – 4,000 people. She stated the committee would like to have dialogue with the organizer who was intending to join by WebEx, however, the clerk noted he was not present. Goede noted she spoke to Mr. Torgerson by phone and he indicated they were trying to get the Wausau Noon Optimists to apply for a picnic license to serve beer, but the application has not yet been filed. Rasmussen stated there were too many questions on the special event application that were not answered and she wanted to question them regarding their distancing plan. *She suggested they approve the other licenses on the list and delay action on Monster Truck to the end of the meeting to allow the organizer time to call in.

Goede noted there is an application from Pine Ridge Mobile, 1205 Merrill Avenue, to add Class A Liquor to their currently held Class A Beer license.

Motion by Peckham, second by Wadinski to approve the licenses on the list, with the exception of the Special Event License for the Monster Truck Tour. Motion carried 5-0.

Consider request for waiver of 3.06.010 Payment of taxes, claims, forfeitures, judgments prior to issuance of license or permit. (Frances Howe)

It was noted Frances Howe was not present. Alfonso stated there were some questions regarding an accident that Ms. Howe was involved in and felt she needed to be present to answer questions. Rasmussen suggest deferring this item to next month's meeting to see if Ms. Howe appears before taking action.

Consider amendment to "Dining on the Streets" Special Event application to include amplified music outside Malarkey's on Thursdays (Wausau River District)

Rasmussen indicated the downtown merchants are requesting adding entertainment on Thursdays to the Dining on the Streets event. She noted they would not be sitting in the street on Thursdays, just using the sidewalk café areas.

Tyler Vogt, Malarkey's, stated the six businesses open downtown all have sidewalk café seating and have noticed if there is musical entertainment outside it draws more people. He commented an acoustic guitar player could help draw foot traffic to the area or people to just sit in The 400 Block to listen. He noted it sometimes happens on the weekend, as well. Rasmussen suggested they be approved for entertainment on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and pop-ups, as needed. Goede noted the Dining in the Streets event was previously amended to extend through September. The temporary sidewalk café premise amendment is valid through October. Rasmussen suggested making all the dates the same.

Motion by McElhaney, second by Peckham to approve the amendment to the "Dining on the Streets" special event to allow for musical entertainment on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and possible weekend pop-ups; and to extend the dining event through October. Motion carried 5-0.

Request for permanent Amendment of Premise for outdoor beer garden - The Glass Hat, 1203 N 3rd St (Gisela Marks, owner)

Rasmussen stated last month there were still some unanswered questions regarding zoning and since then Tara Alfonso spoke with Bill Hebert who indicated the zoning allows for the outdoor area. She noted a permit for fencing and retaining wall is all that needs to be applied for through the Inspections Department.

Gisela Marks stated they have found there may be a drainage issue from the alley. She indicated she spoke with Bill Hebert about possibly building a deck rather than having the asphalt.

Motion by Herbst, second by Wadinski to approve the amendment of premise for outdoor beer garden at The Glass Hat, 1203 N 3rd St. Motion carried 5-0.

Discussion and possible action on amending the City of Wausau Events Policy and Procedures to permit limited use of certain unimproved City owned real property

Rasmussen stated there was a request from the Bridge Clinic to allow a short term event called “Yoga in the Garden” that is on a parcel of land the city owns. There were no provisions to outline event type use on city owned property. The ordinance proposed would allow that type of use on what is essentially vacant land the city owns.

Alfonso stated she put in how many days and/or how many hours, however, these can be changed to whatever they feel is appropriate. She noted the parcel Bridge Clinic wants to use is a small residential lot across the street from their garden. Rasmussen recommended verbiage be inserted that the applicant understands that they are utilizing the property “as is” and they agree to assume all risks based on the condition of the property for their activity.

Discussion followed. Alfonso suggested action on this be postponed as staff was going to discuss what we would do for longer term uses.

Motion by Peckham to permit Bridge Clinic to use this property for this year, with the intention that we prepare a plan to consider similar uses at other city-owned properties. Alfonso pointed out it would be for everyone, not just Bridge Clinic. Rasmussen suggested approving it with a re-evaluation date or sunset of January 1st to see how it works. McElhaney she was comfortable voting for this until it is more completed because it is too broad. Motion died for lack of a second. Consensus was to hold action on the proposal until it can be worked on more in depth with the longer term uses and brought back.

Operations Report from Fire Department for July 2020

No discussion, the report on file.

Chief Bliven presented the Tavern Report from July 1 through July 31, 2020. *(See attached)*

*Rasmussen questioned if the Monster Truck organizer has yet called in to the meeting, but he was unable to be reached. Rasmussen felt the special event application was too incomplete to be able to approve as it was.

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the Special Event for Monster Truck Tour. Motion failed 0-5.

Adjourn

Motion by Herbst, second by Peckham to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 6:00 pm.

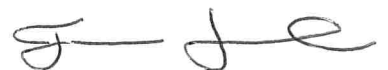

January of 2020 I was in a car accident with a city law enforcement officer at no fault of my own while driving taxi for the local area. Due to the accident and insurance audit I was unable to drive taxi which made a major contribution to monthly income. This event had placed me in a financial hardship; without a taxi license, shortage in employment opportunities for a 64 year old woman nearing retirement. Not only has the loss of my taxi license, but also the pandemic has placed me further into a financial hardship resulting in having to rely on family to make ends meet for my essential needs.

I respectfully request that you and the counsel consider a obligatory payment plan to pay off the debt to the city due to a delinquency of my water bill balance. With this payment plan; it will provide me the opportunity to reinstate my taxi license to pay off the debt and maintain any current balances in the future. I thank you for your time and consideration in assisting me to resolve this debt and my financial hardship.

Re: COMMENTS ON AMENDMENTS TO W.M.C. §8.08.170, Licenses

- The Wausau Municipal Code §8.08.170 Licenses, sets forth the City requirement, which is based upon state law (Wis. Stat. §174.07), that dog owners obtain licenses for those dogs kept within the City limits. In addition to the requirement for dog owners to obtain a license, the City also requires cat owners to obtain a license.
- City ordinance Section 8.08.170(f) also sets forth certain exceptions to the requirement for obtaining a dog license. These include exceptions for dogs kept for educational or scientific purposes or a dog or cat in temporary foster care of a person holding a valid pet fancier permit.
- With respect to an additional exception provided for in the City ordinance that dogs specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons are also exempt from the provisions of Section 8.08.170, questions sometimes arise as to the process, if any, for exercising that exemption.
- State statute provides in Wis. Stat. §174.055 that every person owning a dog specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons shall “receive annually a free dog license from the local collecting officer upon application.” In order to make clear the requirement that an application for the license is still required, the City ordinance is recommended to be amended to more closely track the state statutory language and to make the requirement for submission of an “application” more clear.

(f) The provisions of this section do not apply to:

- (1) A dog or cat in temporary foster care of a person who holds a valid pet fancier permit issued under section 8.08.120(c).
- (2) ~~Dogs specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons.~~
- (3)(2) Dogs kept only for educational or scientific purposes.

(g) Every dog specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons is exempt from the dog license fee of subsection (b) and every person owning such a dog shall receive annually a free dog license upon application to the city.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the day after its publication.

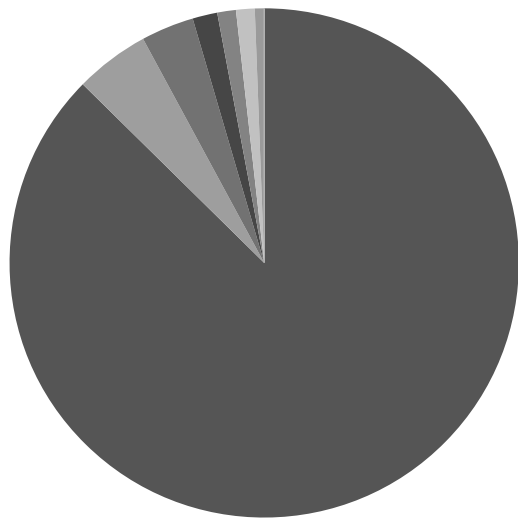

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Domino Bar, 740 Washington Street

- (1) *Case #20006358, 08/20/2020 at 11:33 PM:* A **bartender** called to report a patron through a glass and spat at the bartender. The bartender did not know who the patron was, and reported that the patron was leaving while he was calling. Officers located the suspect outside the bar, at which point he became uncooperative and even threatening. The male was taken into custody under threat of being tased, and was eventually charged with battery, disorderly conduct, and threats to law enforcement (the male threatened to beat the arresting officer).
- (2) *Event #20109137, 08/30/2020 at 6:43 PM:* Law enforcement from another jurisdiction requested mutual aid to check the bar for a person wanted for theft. Officers responded and did not locate the vehicle involved or anyone matching the description of the suspects.

During the interaction, another woman interjected herself into the contact, with the expressed purpose of "making sure the officers that were towering over the woman were not accosting her." In the second woman's concern for the first woman, she advised the first one that she did not need to provide identification, which the officers had asked for in order to determine where the woman could go, as she was too intoxicated or emotionally upset to express to the officers. In the end, the first woman left with the second woman, who promised to find her a cab or other safe ride home. The second woman, who at one point identified herself as a trauma ICU nurse, seemed to have a misconstrued idea that the first woman was in danger from the officers and felt the need to observe the incident as a witness in the event that the officers overstepped their boundaries.

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- (3) *Event # 20108851, 08/30/2020 at 1:35 AM:* Officers were dispatched to the bar in reference to three men fighting. Officers responded and located two men outside the bar, and a third male who took off running. The third male was stopped two blocks away. All three admitted to being friends, and having a heated verbal argument. Nobody wished to pursue charges, and bar management had no problems to report. The one male ran from the scene because he was on probation and shouldn't have been drinking. He was ordered to report to his probation agent as soon as possible. All of the people involved were released at the scene.

Intermission Bar, 325 N 4th Street

From what I could tell, based on how long the moped had been parked there, the operator had been in the bar for approximately eight hours. The operator was never identified.

Loppnow's Bar, 412 N. 3rd Street

- (1) *Case #20005824, 08/06/2020 at 11:45 PM:* A patron called to report that his truck was stolen while he was inside the bar. A few hours later OnStar called to report that the vehicle was located on GPS heading into Minnesota. Law enforcement Minnesota was contacted and the vehicle was stopped. Male was arrested for operating the vehicle without owner's consent, and a gun was also located in the car. The owner of the truck and arrangements to retrieve it from Minnesota.

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Wausau on the Water, 1300 N River Drive
