Minutes of previous meetings. (10/18/21 & 11/01/21)

Motion by McElhaney, second by Wadinski to approve the minutes of the previous meetings on 10/18/21 & 11/01/21. Motion carried 3-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications.

Lisa Rasmussen stated there were no denial recommendations.

Rasmussen noted new applications for a Class A Beer & Liquor License from Skogen's Foodliner, Inc., dba Festival Foods, which is purchasing Trig's next month, and an application for Class B Beer & Class C Wine from A Taste of Jamaica & International Market, LLC. These licenses will be going to the November 23rd Council meeting.

Motion by McElhaney, second by Wadinski to approve the licenses as recommended by staff. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion and possible action of re-reviewing the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommendation with regards to the Class "B" Beer & Liquor License of Allen Woller, d/b/a 6th Street Pub, Premises located at 2002 N. 6th Street, Wausau, WI 54403 due to a possible sale of the business and a voluntary surrender of the Class "B" Beer & Liquor License

Rasmussen explained the committee previously recommended revocation of the license because the owner was in violation of the abandonment ordinance by not being open for an extended period. The recommendation is due to proceed to Council on November 23rd but can be withdrawn before that meeting. She stated Mr. Woller is willing to surrender the license because he has a buyer for the establishment. If the revocation proceeds there will be a six month cool down period for that premise whereby, we can't issue a license to anyone. Mary Goede, Deputy Clerk, indicated Mr. Woller came to City Hall today and signed the voluntary surrender.

Rasmussen noted the potential buyers have filed an application for the license and it will be reviewed by the Liquor License Review Subcommittee on November 30th.

Motion by Wadinski, second by McElhaney to accept the voluntary surrender of the Class B Beer & Liquor license of Allen Woller, premises at 2002 N 6th Street, and withdraw the revocation. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion and possible action on the proposal for the hiring of nine additional Firefighter/Paramedics (Fire Chief Barteck)

Rasmussen stated the Council viewed a presentation at its last meeting regarding the need of additional Firefighter/Paramedics and directed three committees to kick off the process. She indicated PH&S is the first committee to consider and analyze the need and if we agree there is a need, we forward a recommendation on to the Human Resources and Finance Committees. HR Committee will work out the timeline and the application process and the Finance Committee will work out the funding.

Chief Barteck stated at his presentation to the Council he described in detail how they run into difficulties when there are fires that occur when the med units are engaged in EMS calls. Following that meeting a few nights later, that exact scenario occurred when a fire happened at an address in the middle part of the city. He stated the night the fire occurred the city's new digital media person was doing a ride along with a city police officer and captured the incident. Barteck presented a PowerPoint of this fire incident showing precisely why it is so difficult when they are shorthanded.

Discussion followed. Wadinski indicated support for more manpower and believed community input was important and should be strongly considered for a referendum to reach more citizens. Rasmussen felt that a referendum slows down the process because you must wait for an election, the earliest being in April. She commented many times the

proper amount of information has not been absorbed by residents causing critical referendums to fail. She hoped to find a funding and hiring plan without having to use that step to move this along quicker. She noted whenever the city has done a survey on services that they value, public safety is always at the top.

Thomas Brown, 715 N 5th Ave, commented after viewing the presentation, which he felt was excellent, he would support the hiring.

Motion by McElhaney, second by Wadinski to recommend to the Human Resources and Finance Committees to continue the process to add the nine Firefighter/Paramedics. Motion carried 3-0.

Operations Report from Fire Department for October 2021

Deputy Chief Jeremy Kopp pointed to the five fire events the department went to and the mutual aid given to fire and EMS. *Report placed on file.*

Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities

Chief Ben Bliven presented the tavern report for September 27, 2021 through October 31, 2021.

Bliven stated there were 10 calls to Cop Shoppe and he has a call in to the license holder to talk about why so much time has been spent responding there and to ensure they are working with us. He noted there were a couple of incidents where we have not been able to obtain the video from them.

Wausau Fire Department Monthly Report

November 2021

Fire Chief's Report:

Welcome to the first issue of the new monthly activity report for the Wausau Fire Department. We are hoping to improve how we tell the story of the Wausau Fire Department by expanding the report to include narratives from the Deputy Chief, and Division Chief's. They will each cover activity reports, and data from each of our four divisions, Operations, EMS, Training, and Prevention. In addition, I will be writing a cover letter each month covering highlights and my activities as the Fire Chief.

As elected and appointed officials representing the Wausau community, I would greatly appreciate your feedback on how we can best communicate the information you need to make informed decisions. Please contact me with your thoughts, ideas, and topics you would like covered in this report for continued improvement.

The Wausau Fire Department is one of the most misunderstood agencies serving our community. Our title of Fire Department does not help with this confusion. In reality, we are an all-hazards response agency that meets the needs of community members and visitors no matter what the problem might be. It is our hope that a fresh approach to our monthly and annual report can be part of the solution

Additional Firefighter/Paramedic update - On November 9th we made a presentation to the Common Council highlighting the growing problems meeting demand for service with available personnel. The last time the City significantly increased Fire Department staffing levels was in 1970 when they hired 4 additional firefighters to have a total of 60. Today, 52 years later the department sits at 62 staff members. In that period, call volume has increase over 200% and the responsibilities have drastically increase also. In addition, we presented comparative data on how the department measures poorly against national benchmarks for staffing. The common Council agreed to examine the issue.

On November 15th we presented a proposal to hire additional firefighters to the Public Health and Safety Committee. During that presentation we presented a case study of a fire that occurred on November 11th on the 400 block of 11th Ave N. At the time of the fire two of the department's three ambulances were engaged in EMS calls, leaving the corresponding Engine Companies without firefighters. Engine One and Engine Three both responded with only and Engineer and Lieutenant. This left the first arriving Lieutenant to engage in extinguishment by himself until other personnel trickled in. The dramatic video footage was captured by the City's Videographer Ethan Bares while he was doing a ride-along with a Wausau Police Officer. The video will be posted to the department's new YouTube page soon.

The Public Health and Safety agreed with our recommendations and recommended the City hire at least nine additional firefighters. The recommendation moves to the Human Resources Committee on December 13.

YouTube Page - Yes, the department has started a new YouTube page. Ethan Bares is posting the videos he has filmed and edited for us. We are using the platform to connect and educate the community about our department. So far it has been a hit and the videos posted there are steadily gaining in views. Please visit the page and hit the subscribe button to see all the new content that we are producing.

Chaplains – In November we completed interviews with two new volunteer Chaplains that will be joining our current Chaplain Sheldon Miles in serving our department and community. The department has seen great benefits that the support Chaplains provide our staff in the form of emotional support and friendship. Pastors Mike Fox and Erik Olson have begun to meet the staff and orientate into their positions. Both Mike and Erik have strong connections to the fire service and we are excited to welcome them to our team. Each of the Chaplains will be assigned one of the three stations. Sheldon Miles will serve Station One, Mike Fox at Two, and Erik Olson at Three.

Partnership with Marathon County Sheriffs Office - The Wausau Fire Department has supplied paramedics with specialized tactical EMS (TEMS) training to the County SWAT Team. The addition of TEMS paramedics to the SWAT Team has been a very successful program for both agencies. The Sheriffs Office has asked us to expand the program to provide TEMS paramedics to the Mobile Field Force Team (MFF). This team has

specialty training and advanced tactics and equipment to respond to civil unrest incidents. In the last year the MFF Team has responded to events in Kenosha and Madison. In addition, they have been on stand-by for demonstrations in Wausau if any violence would occur. We agree that having TEMS Paramedics on the MFF Team would be a great benefit to both agencies and we are currently working out the details of a Memo of Understanding between our agencies.

In conclusion, I would ask you to please reach out to me with any questions about the contents of this report or if you have recommendations for changes. It is our hope to continually improve this report to tell the story of the Wausau Fire Department and all the ways we serve our community.

EMS Division:

November was an action-packed month for all EMS providers at the Wausau Fire Department.

All 50 paramedics were once again recertified in Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) through the American Heart Association. This is no easy task as it requires a pretest, lecture, practical testing, and a post-class exam. All paramedics passed with flying colors under the tutelage of EMS Division Chief and American Heart Association ACLS Instructor Jared Thompson. Even Chief Barteck earned his ACLS recertification. Every two years all Licensed Wisconsin State Paramedics are required to recertify in ACLS through the American Heart Association.

The EMS Division is pleased to share that another resident of Marathon County survived an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest that occurred on November 22nd at 0100 in the morning from interventions performed by area First Responders and Wausau Fire Department Paramedics. Wausau Fire Department Med-2 staffed with Firefighter/Paramedic Jared Koss and Christopher Berndt responded with Marathon City First Responders and Edgar Area Ambulance to the Village of Marathon City for a 41-year-old female who was not breathing and did not have a pulse. With the Wausau Fire Department's cutting-edge equipment and progressive ACLS protocols, Wausau Fire Paramedics placed a breathing tube in their patient's trachea, defibrillated their patient multiple times, and administered cardiac medication which enabled them to obtain the return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) at 0145. They then transport their patient to Aspirus Wausau Hospital who was then admitted to the Cardiac Intensive Care Unit. Their patient walked out of Aspirus Wausau Hospital on November 29th with full neurologic function.

Fire Training Division:

Department members performed over 924 hours of fire/rescue related training in November. Ten different policies are being created or revised and prepared for departmental review in December. We have obtained a grant to provide Confined Space Rescue training through Wisconsin Emergency Management, in partnership with Marathon County Emergency Management, to provide training for fifteen members as scheduled in March of 2022. A sincere thank you to Tammy Stratz for providing us with opportunities to train in various structures around the city.

Upcoming external training opportunities are being offered to members. Training offerings sent out this month include Incident Safety Officer, Emergency Services Instructor, and Fire Inspector certifications, as well as a leadership presentation by Captain D. Michael Abrashoff, author of *It's Your Ship*.

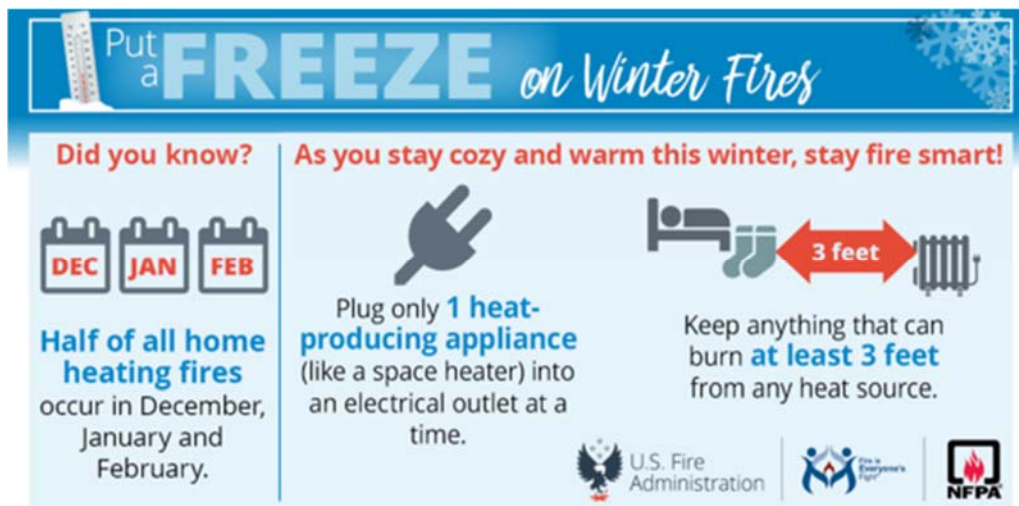

Fire Prevention Division:

Within the City of Wausau for the month of November we performed 361 total inspections. We had 20 properties that had Fire Code Violations. These properties will require follow up inspections to confirm compliance. Our #1 violation is from outdated fire extinguisher maintenance. This violation remains consistent throughout the entirety of the any given year.

Investigations: The prevention Division conducted a total of three Fire Investigations (car, garage and a house) throughout November. We also conducted an Investigation last March (03/01/2021) that was brought to trial the month of November. This required multiple meetings with the City Attorney's office. The Wausau Fire Department obtained it's very first "Expert Witness" to testify. Lt. Shahn Kariger went through a Daubert Challenge brought forth by the Public Defender's office and was deemed qualified by the presiding judge as an expert witness. Lt. Kariger is our departments first expert witness in its history.

Public Outreach: Our Public outreach programs for November encompass Fire Drill education with the Wausau school district and Smoke Detector and CO detector installations. We performed a total of three Fire Drill this month reaching 162 adults and 1,267 students. We had one Smoke and CO installs reaching one household with one occupant.

Fire Operations Division:

November was a very busy month in operations as can be seen with the numbers and reports from all divisions. There are many policies and procedures being worked on out of the Deputy Chief's office in conjunction with each division and released in Lexipol. We have obtained a grant to provide Confined Space Rescue training through Wisconsin Emergency Management, in partnership with Marathon County Emergency Management, to provide training for fifteen members as scheduled in March of 2022. There has been some minor warranty repairs made to the new Sutphen Engines that required the apparatus to be sent back to Custom Fire Apparatus and are both back and in service.

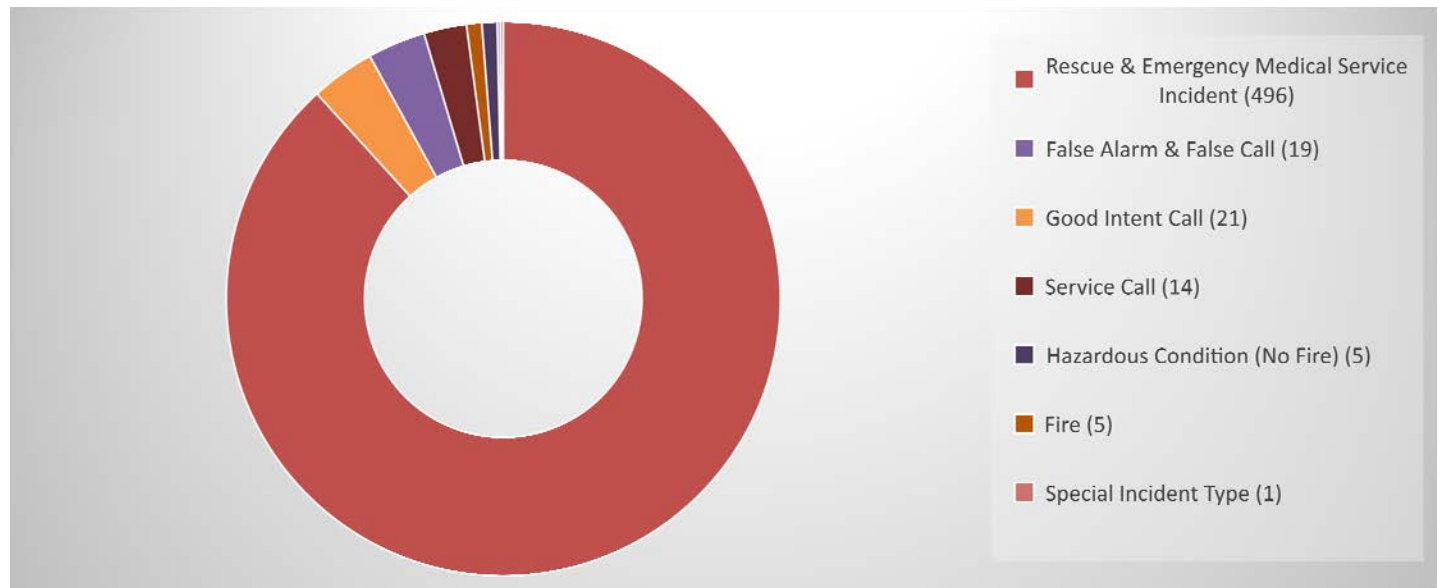
Crews have started scheduling tours of target structures in the city to gain familiarity as well as exposure to these buildings for new personnel. This had not been done in the last year during Covid concerns.

Ground ladders have all been tested in November as required once a year by NFPA standards.
