Minutes of previous meetings. (10/19/20)

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the minutes of the 10/19/20 meeting. Motion carried 4-0.

Consider approval or denial of various license applications.

Rasmussen stated there was one denial recommendation for a Public Transport Driver License for Shaun Bordeaux. It was noted that Mr. Bordeaux was not present to appeal.

Rasmussen stated there was one Special Event application from Wausau Events for the Holiday Parade on December 4th, which would be a reverse parade in Marathon Park, where the floats would remain stationary with the cars driving past to view them.

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve or deny license applications as recommended by staff. Motion carried 4-0.

Discussion and possible action regarding Ordinance Creating Chapter 5.50 Practice of massage or bodywork therapy and related Ordinance Amending Section 1.01.025(c)(1)(B) Schedule of cash deposits

Lt. Melinda Pauls explained for the last couple years complaints have come in from different businesses regarding phone calls to their businesses asking for services they don't render and most massage therapists that are licensed with the state would not render those types of services. She noted one of the massage parlors they are looking at offered these services to a client unwanted. The biggest issue is most of the therapists offering this are not licensed massage therapists. This ordinance would adopt the state statute to give police the authority to go in and check the licensing.

Chief Ben Bliven clarified that the services Lt. Pauls is referring to are sexual services. The complaints that are coming in are for unlicensed massage therapists who accept money for a massage and at the end offer sexual acts. The difficulty for enforcement is that it doesn't meet the definition of prostitution because it is a consensual act between two adults and the money that is exchanged is for the massage. He indicated Cpt. Graham and Lt. Pauls worked on and sent out a survey to all the registered massage therapy businesses in the city and received a very good response. He stated 16 responded and at least half of them are aware of these issues and are in favor of enforcing the state requirement

Bliven indicated the ordinance is similar to the West Allis ordinance which has helped them with enforcement. He felt it was important to note that one of the significant concerns about these establishments is human trafficking.

Motion by Herbst, second by Peckham to approve both the creation of the ordinance and the fine for the fee schedule. Motion carried 5-0.

Shahn Kariger, Fire Inspector, explained the compliance engine is a simple internet based tool for code officials to track and drive code compliance, reduce false alarm activity and provide a safer community. It provides a secure cloud environment to which third party contractors that inspect, test and maintain fire protection systems submit reports via a web portal directly to the Fire Department. This facilitates a more efficient review, tracking and follow up process with occupants to correct deficiencies and maintain systems. In addition to the web based technology, the services include a team to administer hard and soft copy notifications, perform follow up calls to increase testing

and maintenance activity within the jurisdiction. He stated the end result is a comprehensive and accurate aggregation of data. The Fire Chief will be better equipped to do more with less in a mission to drive 100% code compliance with the fire and life safety laws.

Kariger explained once the compliance engine is adopted, all of the contractors within the state that do any business in the Wausau area will be contacted and informed. These contractors will be required to upload their reports from performing a testing or service and the information is recorded. He commented they currently only get bits and pieces and don't really know when things are done until they go do inspections, but with this program they can look at any property to see what has been tested and if there are any issues that need follow up prior to going there. He noted this is free to the city and all the businesses. The third party contractors that perform the service have to pay a \$15 fee per report when they upload, which is typically on an annual basis. *Discussion followed.*

Motion by Peckham, second by Herbst to approve the participation and the compliance engine. Motion carried 4-0.

Discussion and possible action on public education efforts surrounding use of facial coverings to reduce spread of Covid-19, and discussion of alternatives for mask access by citizens in need

Rasmussen commented the committee doesn't know yet how large of a problem mask access is and will need to reach out some of the non-profits who provide services to find out if there are issues with either sourcing masks or distributing them.

Mayor Rosenberg stated there is access to masks through the Emergency Management Partnership for both cotton and surgical masks. She indicated she could provide a list of things that are currently in the works. She noted the County Board Health & Human Services Committee is looking to work with Wisconsin Institute for Public Policy and Service (WIPPS) for a more public engagement process when it comes to masks. It is an opportunity to hear from people who have all kinds of feelings about this and make sure everyone is talking through it and understanding the science.

Rasmussen questioned if there was a different approach to take in terms of promotions and information circulation. She referred to several links on information in their packets that were submitted by Sarah Watson. *Discussion followed.*

Michelle Van Krey, Community Development, stated WIPPS has a program currently running to target both the Hispanic and Hmong communities in Wausau and creating liaisons that are already engrained in those communities to help spread the message about masks and Covid in a way they can understand. She indicated WIPPS applied for and received CARES funding through Community Development for the Hmong Community.

Peckham requested this item be placed on the December PH&S agenda for an update.

Tavern Activities / Compliance Checks / Law Enforcement Activities

Chief Bliven presented the Tavern Report from October 1, 2020 through October 31, 2020. *(See attached)*

Rasmussen stated she was concerned that M&R Station is back up to 100 demerit points and the owner appears to have been selective about video provided regarding a fight outside. She noted the owner has already appeared before the committee for a formal expression of concern and had committed to do better regarding video surveillance. Rasmussen requested there be a follow up discussion from PD with Mr. Gordon.

Rasmussen stated there is ongoing issues at Aftershock. The current owner moved Tremor's bar when Thomas Street was reconstructed to this Lenard Street location. This building has always been a bar, but previous owners did not present any problem for the neighborhood. A neighbor took pictures of patrons using drugs outside and almost every weekend there is alcohol outside. Although the owner seems to want to do the right thing, she is apparently seldom there and her husband told the neighbor to stop calling police. Chief Bliven indicated he would have a conversation with the owner. He agreed when the premise was Baker's Retreat there weren't any of these issues.

Chief Bliven stated they have not been doing routine tavern inspections as a result of Covid, but he is going to have them resume inspections at establishments that are having problems, such as M&R Stations, Roc's, and Aftershock.

Re: Comments on Creating W.M.C. §5.64.036.05 Temporary Exception to Drive-Up Sales
Prohibition of W.M.C. §5.64.036

- In November of 2018, the Common Council approved an ordinance, W.M.C. §5.64.036 Drive-up sales, that prohibited drive-up alcohol sales at any licensed premises in the City. Drive-up alcohol sales under this ordinance are “defined as the sale of intoxicating beverages to customers in a vehicle located outside a licensed premises.” Its purpose was to have the effect of requiring face to face sales of alcohol occur within the licensed premises where identification and age could be checked by proper employees of the business, and thereby avoid sales to individuals who might already be intoxicated or might be underage.
- In March, 2020, the Mayor of Wausau issued Executive Declaration No. 3 pursuant to City of Wausau Proclamation of State of Emergency, temporarily suspending application of the ordinance concerning drive-up alcohol sales to the extent it might interfere with the ability of bars and taverns to permit “carry-out sales” of alcohol beverages in original, sealed containers. This Executive Declaration was subsequently ratified by the Common Council. This occurred during the time of the State’s “Safer at Home Order,” and Governor Evers Emergency Order #8 which among other things banned mass gatherings but also provided that while breweries, brewpub, wineries, distilleries, and alcohol beverage retailers, including bars were to be closed to the public, these businesses would be permitted to allow “carry-out” sales of alcohol beverages and food if permitted by state law and municipal ordinance. These State and Municipal Orders are now expired and thus, the provisions of W.M.C. §5.64.036 prohibiting drive-up sales are once again in full force and effect.
- Given the on-going COVID-19 pandemic, the question has arisen as to whether the prohibition on drive-up sales of alcohol beverages should again be suspended. The proposed ordinance being considered at this time, would in effect once again temporarily suspend the prohibition by creating an exception to the ordinance’s prohibitions as applied to restaurants and grocery stores. Convenience stores and gas stations would be excluded.

- There are a number of standards and requirements set forth in the proposed draft ordinance. These are presented for the Committee's consideration and discussion. The Committee may find some of these standards are requirements are not necessary, or may wish to add others.
- The ordinance is also drafted so that it would automatically sunset. A date for that sunset, however, is not included in the draft and a request is made of the Committee for direction as to the time period it would like to recommend.
- Finally, permitting temporary drive-up sales of alcohol beverages by restaurants and grocery stores would require these businesses to apply for a temporary amendment to their licensed premises. Consideration should be given as to who would be authorized to issue this temporary amendment. To facilitate the ability of restaurants and grocery stores to offer this service quickly to its customers, the Committee may desire to recommend this authority to be delegated to a staff person or jointly to two or more City staff.

The Common Council of the City of Wausau do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 5.64.036.05 Temporary exception to drive-up sales prohibition is hereby created to read as follows:

5.64.036.05 Temporary exception to drive-up sales prohibition. (a) Purpose and Intent. The Common Council recognizes the need to continue to slow the spread of the COVID-19 coronavirus as infection numbers continue to rise throughout the community during the winter of 2020 – 2021 by encouraging individuals to maximize social distancing and minimize contact during the COVID-19 pandemic. In that regard it further recognizes the health, safety, and convenience benefits available to its citizens through on-line ordering services including orders from restaurants and grocery stores. Accordingly, the Common Council wishes to provide temporary relief to restaurants and grocery stores that hold a valid alcohol beverage license by creating a temporary exception to the provisions of section 5.64.036 Drive-up sales upon compliance with all of the provisions of this section during the COVID-19 pandemic period to allow for the drive-up or curb-side sales of alcohol beverages in original, sealed containers in conjunction with the sale of drive-up or curb-side food or grocery orders.

(b) Definitions.

- (i) “Alcohol beverage” has the meaning set forth in Wis. Stat. s. 125.02(1).
- (ii) “Convenience store” means a store with extended opening hours, stocking a limited range of household goods, groceries or other food and beverage items.
- (iii) “Grocery store” means a store that sells a wide range of food and household goods. A grocery store does not include a gas station selling limited food, snack and beverage items or a convenience store.
- (iv) “Restaurant” has the meaning set forth in Wis. Stat. s. 125.02(18).

(c) Conditions for drive-up or curbside alcohol sales. A restaurant or grocery store holding a valid, alcohol beverage license, may temporarily permit the sale of drive-up or curbside alcohol beverages in conjunction with the sale of food or grocery orders upon compliance with all of the following conditions:

(i) Submission of an application to temporarily expand the area identified as the licensee's "licensed premises" to include the area in which it intends to conduct drive-up or curbside sales, together with approval of the application by _____. The premises proposed for temporary expansion must be contiguous to the licensed premises approved as part of the applicant's original, annual license. Any person aggrieved by the denial of an application may appeal to the _____.

(ii) Submission of an operations plan with the application including the protocol for assuring underage and intoxicated persons are unable to secure alcohol through drive-up or curbside sales. Applications without the operations plan will not be considered.

(iii) The licensee or licensed establishment shall not have more than 50 (fifty) demerit points pursuant to section 5.64.078 on the date of application.

(c) Expiration of temporarily expanded licensed premises area. The temporarily expanded licensed premise area shall be effective only for a time period expiring _____ at 11:59 pm. On 11:59 pm on _____, the temporarily expanded licensed premise area shall automatically return to the area identified and approved as part of the licensee's annual license application without further action required upon the part of the licensee or Common Council. The application for a temporary amendment of licensed premises shall include an acknowledgement and consent of the applicant to the automatic reversion of the temporary expansion as set forth herein in the form supplied by the city clerk. Further, the licensee's application for and acceptance of the temporarily expanded licensed premises area shall further demonstrate the licensee's consent to the automatic reversion of the licensed premises as provided herein.

(d) Standards and requirements. Any licensee granted a temporary expansion of its licensed premises under this section shall comply with the following additional standards and requirements where the drive-up or curbside sale includes alcohol beverages:

(i) Pick up hours are limited to 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Orders placed after 2:00 p.m. may not be picked up until the following day.

(ii) There shall be a minimum 4 hour waiting period between the time of order and pick-up time.

(iii) No drive-up or curbside alcohol sale shall occur unless also accompanied by a food order totaling at least \$15.00.

(iv) A licensed bartender/operator must perform the sale.

(v) If the purchaser is not the driver of the vehicle, the licensed bartender/operator employee must ensure the driver is 21 or older.

(vi) Payment for the order cannot be consummated until the purchaser is at the licensed premises and identification and age has been verified. No alcohol sales shall be permitted in the absence of valid photo identification.

(vii) The pick-up area must be clearly identified with markings, signs or barriers.

(viii) No tasting events are allowed in the designated pick-up area.

Section 2. All provisions of City ordinances not specifically altered by this temporary ordinance shall remain in effect.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on the day after its publication.

Section 4. This ordinance shall automatically repeal on _____ at 11:59 pm; no further action shall be required.

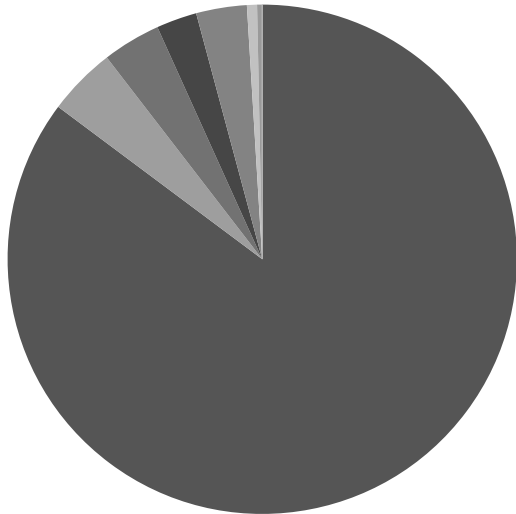

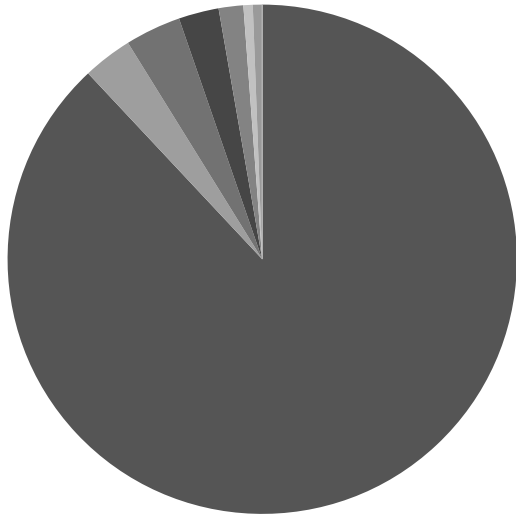

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Cop Shoppe Bar, 701 Washington Street

- (1) *Event #20143811, 11/10/2020 at 10:21 PM:* The **bartender** called to report a male refusing to leave the property. Within minutes, the male left the bar upon learning that the bartender had called the police. The bartender called back explaining this, and stated the Police were no longer needed.

El Jalapenos, 300 N. 3rd Street

- (1) *Event #20145679, 11/15/2020 at 1:51 AM:* A **bar employee** called to report a problem with three males in the bar trying to start fights and refusing to leave. The employee stated the males were kicked out of the bar but continued to walk back and forth near the bar. There was never a full-on fight, however there was some “bumping” due to the crowded bar. The males had taken this personally and attempted to escalate the situation. Another officer located the males walking away from the bar. They were warned not to return to the bar for the remainder of the night. No further law enforcement action was taken.
- (2) *Case #20009293, 11/29/2020 at 2:26 AM:* Police were called at the request of the **bar employee** for a large fight involving several people. Information obtained from people that were involved in the fight indicated that there was a dispute between patrons of Mexican descent and patrons of Puerto Rican descent. There were some reports of a male having been armed with a gun, however officers were unable to substantiate those reports. Video surveillance was observed from the bar, and also one citizen, that indicated some of the main perpetrators. A total of three people were cited for disorderly conduct at the scene.

Loppnow's Bar, 1502 N. 3rd Street

- (1) *Case #20009291, 11/29/2020 at 1:54 AM:* A call was received reporting that there was a couple people fighting outside of the bar. Further information from the caller stated that they had been fighting inside the bar, then went outside and continued fighting. It was reported that the males both took their shirts off and were fighting. One male was detained as officers arrived. That male was later pointed out by the bartender as being the “instigator.” This male was issued a citation for disorderly conduct based on the description given by the bartender.

Denmar Tavern, 601 W. Thomas Street

- (1) *Event #20141980, 07/06/2020 at 10:53 PM:* An officer respond to the bar after dispatch received a 911 open line call from a cell phone that tracked back to the bar location. Contact was made with the owner of the phone who voluntarily showed the officer his call log. It appeared there were approximately 10 recent “901” calls. The owner of the phone told the officer’s phone is new and calling 911 was an accident, so there is no emergency.

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Roc's Place Bar, 810 S. 3rd Avenue

- (1) *Event #20139124, 11/01/2020 at 1:59 AM:* The **bartender** called to report a fight involving several people in the bar. The fight continued outside the bar. Investigation determined that two males began fighting physically inside the bar, and the remainder of the patrons formed them in an attempt to stop the fight at the time the call for follow-up was to be done including getting video from the bar. Video was later obtained however no further evidence supported any enforcement action.
- (2) *Event #20141480, 11/06/2020 at 1:08 AM:* An officer stopped by the bar to speak to the bartenders regarding a previous incident from earlier in the evening, which was determined to be an unreported altercation that occurred in the parking lot. The officer was outside the bar, talking with two bartenders in the parking lot. The bartenders had close the bar because they were able to anticipate that a problem was going to occur. Once everybody was outside the bar a fight erupted. The people involved in the fight moved over to M & R Station, where another fight ensued. While talking about this chain of events with two of the bartenders, one of the bartenders reported to the officer that a male was beating up a female in the back of the parking lot by picnic table. The officer moved to that location and observed a female getting up from the ground next to a male who was hunched over her. Both parties denied that altercation had taken place. Eventually the woman claimed that she threw herself onto the ground in order to get the males attention after he had been looking at other women in the bar. The bartender that originally witnessed the incident was no longer as enthusiastic to provide information about what she observed. The other bartender that was there, had not seen what was happening, but told the officer that it wasn't fair because, "... when you work here, you can't say things." The male and female that were involved in the incident were released. I did not find indication that the male had been identified. The female was identified, although the officers did not check her record while on scene. Although the officer ascertained that the female was not injured, felt safe, and did not admit to having been assaulted in any way, to my knowledge they did not address the fact that she was on probation and should not have been drinking.
- (3) *Event #20145682, 11/15/2020 at 2:10 AM:* An officer driving by the bar observed an extremely irritated male being restrained by another in front of the bar. Upon stopping and assessing what was occurring, he learned the agitated male was intoxicated after celebrating his birthday, and was having an argument with his girlfriend. The other male was his sober driver and was trying to take care of him. Officers remained in the area until the bars had closed and cleared out.

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Treu's Tic Toc Club, 1201 W. Thomas Street

- (1) *Case #20008789, 11/08/2020 at 9:19 AM:* Officers responded to a commercial burglar alarm. Officers discovered an exterior door unsecured. The building was cleared and nothing was found to be amiss. The manager responded and checked the videos just to be certain. False alarm report was completed.
- (2) *Case #20008877, 11/12/2020 at 8:29 PM:* The **manager/owner** called to report that he suspected two males in the bar that were stealing from the entertainment machines. The suspects had left the bar by the time officers arrived. Surveillance was utilized to put out a notification of the suspects to neighboring jurisdictions. Eventually the same two were apprehended in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. An admission was made of their involvement in the theft at this establishment, and an attempt at another, Aftershock.
- (3) *Case #20009057, 11/19/2020 at 2:32 PM:* The **bar owner** called to report that they received two counterfeit \$20 bills during the previous evening's business. Bills were collected and a report was completed by the investigating officer. It is not likely that there video system would have been able to tell which patron passed those \$20 bills.

M & R Station, 818 S. 3rd Avenue

- (1) *Case #20008741, 11/06/2020 at 12:44 AM:* The **bartender** called to report an active fight following 10 to 15 people at the bar. He stated most of it was occurring inside the bar, and they had just showed up and started fighting. An update provided by the bartender noted that all the people had moved outside, and they were locking the bar up to keep them out. The bartender reported getting hit in the chest by a pool ball. On arrival, officers found no one outside the bar there was glass in the roadway from bottles that had been thrown, and other patrons and neighbors were interviewed but did not provide any meaningful information. The bar owner was on scene, however he was intoxicated. He stated that the fight had started at Roc's Place and moved to his bar and exploded. Hauser advised the owner that he would have to review the video from the bar to further investigate the incident. The owner agreed and said he, would work on getting it to him. The officer attempted contact at the bar three days later, however it was closed. The next chance the officer got to inquire about the video was seven days later. He was advised that the footage had overridden itself and was no longer available. As a result, no further investigation took place. Refer to incident #2 at Roc's Place, as listed above, for further reference of this rolling fight incident.
- (2) *Case #20008739, 11/06/2020 at 1:21 AM:* A patron of the bar reported that his phone had been stolen during the above noted fight. When trying to call the phone, a female answered it and offered to return the phone if paid money. Also as noted above, the video footage of who might have taken the phone was eventually unavailable.

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Aftershock Bar, 1418 Lenard Street

- (1) *Event #20148201, 11/21/2020 at 7:51 PM:* An officer stopped by the bar for follow-up investigation regarding a theft of money. 2 males had been implicated in stealing money from entertainment machines in local bars. The bartender noted that the males had been in the bar, but had not gotten any payout from machines. This was part of a larger investigation, including Treu's Tic Toc, which had been victimized by the same suspects. They were arrested in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, and admitted to going to bars in Wausau to commit the same crime.
- (2) *Event #20151124, 11/28/2020 at 1:29 AM:* A refused complainant called to report that a patron from the bar had urinated on their driveway. While the caller was talking to dispatch, the person left the area (not back to the bar). An officer responded but could not locate anyone in the area and did not make contact with any bar employees regarding the complaint.

Labor Temple, 318 S. 3rd Avenue

- (1) *Case #20009257, 11/28/2020 at 2:14 AM:* An officer on patrol driving past the bar observed a female fall onto the ground and flail about violently. Officers attempted to stabilize her, although it seemed that she intentionally made it difficult to do so. When she had been in the bar, she started out relatively normal, according to the bartender. She started falling down inside the bar, so the bartender asked her to step outside. She was transported to the hospital by ambulance. While the woman was at the hospital, she became disruptive and officers were required to return and stabilize her again, and sedated by the hospital staff. In the end, she was referred for disorderly conduct and bail jumping. She was released from the hospital to the care of her mother.

Showtime Gentlemen's Club, 1709 Merrill Ave

- (1) *Event #20148273, 11/20/2020 at 11:43 PM:* A patron called requesting a lockout from a local tow company. The tow company requested an officer respond as well, in the event that the caller was intoxicated. An officer responded and made contact with the owner of the car and the tow company. It was determined that the owner of the car was not intoxicated, and in fact, had an IID installed in the car. The vehicle was opened for the owner.
